Important Background Information Regarding the Declaration

Purpose of the Declaration

- 1. It announced to the world the separation of the thirteen colonies from Great Britain.
- 2. It established the United States of America.

Why was Thomas Jefferson chosen to write the Declaration of Independence?

- 1. He had a way with words! (a good writer)
- 2. He already wrote a pamphlet called "A Summary View of the Rights of British America"

Date of the Declaration

- 1. July 4, 1776
- 2. The day Continental Congress approved the final draft of the Declaration.

Signing the Declaration

- 1. On July 19, 1776, the Continental Congress ordered a formal copy of the Declaration to be made for signing.
- 2. On August 2, the final parchment was presented to Congress and the signing began.
- 3. Over time 56 delegates signed the formal copy, but some present at the vote on July 4 never signed.

The Outline of Our Declaration of Independence

Section I (1st Paragraph)

1. It is important to justify (give reasons) why the colonists are breaking political ties with Great Britain.

Section II (Natural Rights)

- 1. The basic rights that all men are guaranteed. (Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of happiness)
- 2. When a government ignores the rights of its people, the people have the right to establish a new government.

Section III (Colonists' Complaints against the King)

1. The long list of things the king has done to the colonists.

Section IV (An Independent United States)

- 1. The colonists declared their independence from Great Britain.
- 2. The colonies will be known as the United States of America.
