About the artist:

Francis Kéré is an architect from Gando, Burkina Faso. In 2004, he won the Aga Khan for Architecture award for his first building, the Grando Primary School. This led to him founding Kéré Architecture in 2005 which is focused on building and creating contemporary and innovative designs. They focus on the idea of creating nontraditional buildings that are strongly rooted in the idea of creating designs to best serve the community. Kéré focuses on social commitment, sustainability and innovation and often uses local

materials in his projects. Kéré became the first African Architect to win the Pritzker Architecture Prize in 2022.
