This document is your one-stop shop for researching your elected representatives at all levels of government.

How to Use this Worksheet:

- 1. S THIS IS A VIEW-ONLY TEMPLATE! Click 'File' > 'Make a copy' (then bookmark!) or 'Download' to save an editable version
- 2. Save this document somewhere handy and add to it over time.
- 3. For each elected official you research, copy/paste a new research table (template at the bottom).
- 4. Use the search tools linked therein and, of course, the internet to do your research!
- 5. When it comes time to email or meet with these elected officials, reference this document to prepare a message that will uniquely resonate with them. Use the Climate Changemakers Action Playbooks to contact your elected officials about the climate issues most important to you! Pro Tip: As your document grows, use the Google Docs outline function (3 lines icon in the upper left) to navigate to each section!
