
# IMPLEMENTATION

## 4.2 Company Registration


This page is used to register to obtain the company credentials such as name and email. The credentials will be stored using the state management service and will be submitted when the user completes his or her signup.



**Fig 4.2: Company Registration Page**


### 4.3 Signup form

**Fig 4.3a: Signup page**



The form for this signup page contains input for username, email and password. The password must contain a capital letter, small letter, number and a symbol.

## 4.4 Admin role page




Fig 4.5: Questions lists page

The opinion poll page is used to select opinions. The maximum number of options is 4. When a user clicks on the submit button the opinion of the user is stored in the database.




Fig 4.6: Opinions Poll Page

This page shows the result of the meeting/opinion poll using a pie chart. It also shows the option and the number of counts when a user hovers over a particular region of the pie chart.




Fig 4.7: Response Page

This page contains a form used to create a token column for a potential user in the token table when the user clicks on the create token button. This page can only be viewed by an admin.




Fig 4.9: Create Token page




Fig 4.10: Token list page

This page displays the list of users registered to the company or society, the edit button navigates to the edit user page while the delete button deletes the user.




Fig 4.11: Users page

This page is used to assign and remove admin roles from users. It is accessible only to admins.




Fig 4.12: Edit user page
