In the final part of the introduction, the purpose of the article writing should be stated. They should be represented in the literature review to show the brand new of the scientific article.

METHOD

The method explains how the research is conducted, including research design, data collection, research instrument and analytic methods. This part should be narrated.



RESULT AND DISCUSSION

This part consists of the research results and how they are discussed. The results obtained from the research have to be supported by sufficient data. The research results and the discovery must be the answers, or the research hypothesis or research question stated previously in the introduction part.

Figures and Tables

Figures and tables must be centered in the column. Large figures and tables may span across both columns. Any table or figure that takes up more than 1 column width must be positioned either at the top or at the bottom of the page.

Figure Captions

Figures must be numbered using Arabic numerals. Figure captions must be in 8 pt Regular font. Captions of a single line must be centered whereas multi-line captions must be justified. Captions with figure numbers must be placed after their associated figures.

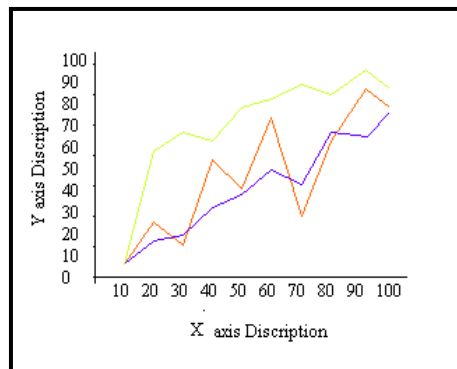

Research limitations and recommendations contain deficiencies in the research and suggestions associated with further ideas from the research.

All the references used in the article must be listed in this part. In this part, all the used references must be taken from primary sources (scientific journals and the least number is 80% from all the references) that were published in the last ten years. Each article should have at least ten references. Authors should cite several **Res Publica: Journal of Social Policy Studies** articles, 3 articles minimum.
