Students will:

Create a personal body of work

Create work with thematic ties

Plan their work and reflect on their work in writing

Develop their technical and conceptual understanding of photography

<u>Part I:</u>

Introduction:

Throughout the year we have explored various themes and techniques in photography. For your final project you are to create, compose and implement such themes and techniques into 25 "Quality" photographs. We will define "Quality" as a class.

Criteria:

- Choose **2** or more themes from below, or come up with your own themes and have them approved by your teacher.
- Complete project outline and get it approved by your teacher.
- Google search your topic (look at examples taken by other photographers, FIND INSPIRATION! Save images if needed)
- Take pictures both inside and out of school.
- Choose how you will edit images. Each image should be brought into photoshop and edited in one way or another, whether this be adjusting lighting or creating composite or collage images.
- Written Reflection (see below for guidelines)
- Upload your 25 best images to your google site by the end of the class _____. Upload and link your written reflection to your google site by the end of the class _____. Label as "Final Project".

Themes (Choose 2 or come up with your own):

Portraiture:

Create a series of either self or peer portraits, focus on lighting and background, color and possibly textures.

Architecture:

Choose some place in which architecture intrigues you and/or creates an interesting composition to build into a series of photographs. Focus on how the shapes interact with the composition of the photographs.

Nature:

Use nature as your source of inspiration. Focus on light, value, texture, color, and shadow.

Famous Photographer:

Search the names of the famous or contemporary photographers make a series of photographs in a similar style or genre or copy imagery as needed

Studio Photography:

Create a series of photographs in the studio focusing on various lighting techniques and their effect on photography. Choose subject matter to photograph (i.e. Still life of objects)

Line:

The element of line can be very influential in photography mostly in directing the view around the photograph. Focus on this element within your series, research line and photography for inspiration.

Abstraction:

Create a series of images exploring abstraction. Use your macro setting, unique angles, and discover a new way of looking at the world.

Narrative:

Tell a story through your images. Have a photoshoot with a friend or take self portraits that create a sense of narrative. (horror, comedy, mystery?)

Other:

Choose your own topic separate from that which is listed above, brainstorm ideas, and map out what you wish to photograph. Themes must be approved by your teacher.

NOTE:

You will complete a project proposal outlining how you will approach this project. The proposal must be approved by your teacher. Beyond this, your project is self-led. It is important that you use class time and outside of class time to shoot and edit your images. The end of the school year will come fast! Take all of the information you have learned this semester and play with it.

Link your written reflection to your "Final Project" in your google sites.

What to write about:

- What editing and shooting techniques did you use?
- What compositional tools did you think about, ie shape, color, line? Give examples.
- What themes/series did you explore?
- Why did you choose the themes you did?
- How did you come up with your idea(s)?
