Instructions for figures

- **File Format & Quality:** All figures must be submitted as a ZIP file. For quality purposes, we require images at a resolution of 300dpi or higher. Submit figures in TIFF, EPS, or high-resolution JPEG/PNG format. Do not embed figures in Microsoft Word or PowerPoint files.
- **Naming:** Name files using the lead author's surname and figure number (e.g., Jones_Fig1.tiff).
- **Captions:** Each figure should include a title and a caption (max 50 words) within the manuscript text, not embedded in the image file.
- **Legibility:** Avoid using text on figures if possible. If the use of text on a figure is necessary, ensure the text size is sufficiently large to be readable when the figure is shown in print size.
- **Color & Grayscale:** As the print edition is black and white, ensure all color figures remain legible when converted to grayscale. We recommend using distinct patterns or symbols in addition to color to differentiate data points.
- **Permissions:** Authors are responsible for obtaining written permission to reuse any figures previously published elsewhere.
