Parents' Right-To-Know

Please be aware that you may request, and the school will provide in a timely manner, information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teacher(s), including the following:

- o Whether the teacher has met state qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- o Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- o The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- o Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualification.
