Academic Help:

Please discuss extra academic help directly with your student's teacher. Do this as soon as you notice your student is struggling.

Math Help runs daily during the 2nd half of the lunch hour in the Math Hall. Posters are on each Math room door identifying the classroom being used and a different math teacher is available daily. This allows students to choose to go on a specific day if they want help from a specific teacher. Math teachers will mention these sessions regularly during class, so encourage your student to ask your teacher for the details. The Math Help room is also a welcoming space for students who wish to work during lunch but may not necessarily need help.

In some school years, senior students set up a **Peer Support Program** at lunch mainly in Math and Science subjects. Have your student drop by the Guidance Department to ask if a program is running.

Tips for Students on how to be successful with Academics:

- Be present and on time for class.
 - o Inform the teacher ahead of time when a known absence is approaching.
 - Make time to ask the teacher what was missed for any absence
- Ask questions when you don't understand something -- extra help is always available.

Understand how your grade is determined by the teacher:

the evaluation of student learning. (AER, p. 15)

From the WRDSB's Assessment and Evaluation (AER) document, evidence of student learning is collected over the whole semester from three different sources -- observations, conversations, and student products. The observation and conversation pieces data Observations depend on your student being present. The use of three different sources is referred to as triangulation of assessment. Using multiple sources of evidence increases the reliability and validity of Conversations
