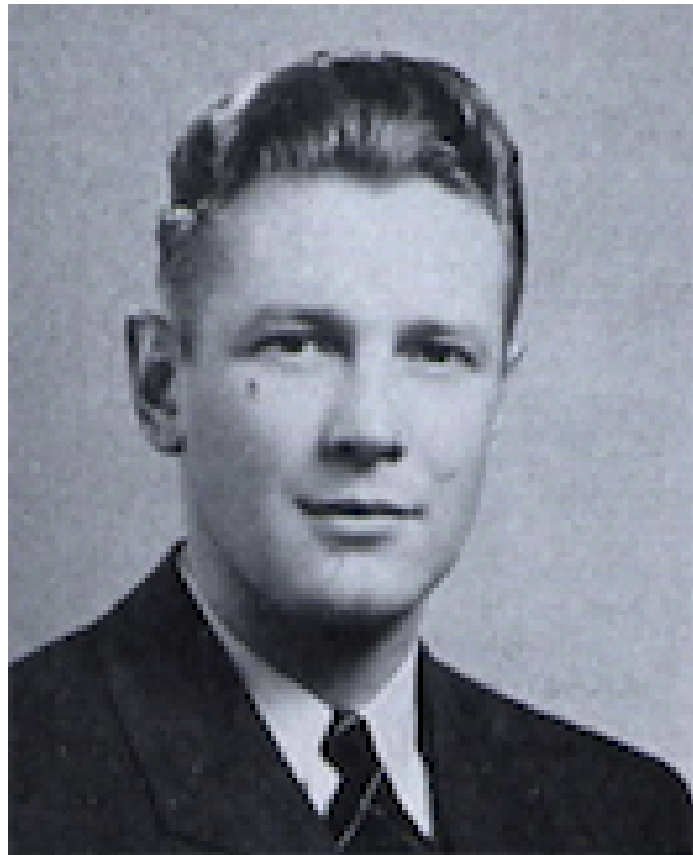

Former Star Athlete Meets Death in Crash

Clarence "Kie" Daniels, 43, a former athletic great at Oshkosh State College, met death Friday afternoon when his car crashed into a tree along the road leading to Lake Shore Golf Course Clubhouse.

It was not yet determined early this morning if Daniels was the victim of a heart attack or if he died of injuries sustained in the crash. An autopsy was scheduled to be performed today.

City police said Daniels' car struck one of the trees lining the road leading to the golf course clubhouse after it had rounded a curve near the No. 4 fairway.

Show Brakes Applied

Police said that a definite mark indicated that the brakes of the auto were applied. The mark existed 33 feet before the vehicle struck the tree. Police were called at 1:13 p.m. and Daniels was taken to Mercy Hospital in the city ambulance, but was believed to have been dead on arrival.

Daniels, who resided at 442 Waugoo St., was a well known golfer, competing in a number of city tournaments and tourneys throughout the state. He was chairman of the golf committee of the Oshkosh Elks lodge and finished second in the state Elks golf tourney at Fond du Lac this year.

He participated in athletics at Oshkosh High School and played end for three years on Oshkosh State football teams. He also was a center on Oshkosh State basketball teams for three years.

Born, Educated Here

He was born in Oshkosh on Aug. 30, 1914, attended High School and Oshkosh State College, where he starred in basketball, football and golf. He was a veteran of World War II, having served with the Navy.

He was married here to Miss Velma Plouff on Aug. 2, 1941. Mr. Daniels was employed as an agent by Northwestern National Life Insurance Company of Minneapolis. He was a member of Oshkosh Lodge 292 of Elks and Our Savior's Lutheran Church.

Surviving are his wife, Velma; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Daniels, Oshkosh; two daughters, Sue Ann and Deborah, and two sons, Mark and Eric, at home; and one brother, Roy Daniels, Oshkosh.
