

ECOSOC - Combating Piracy in the Gulf of Guinea

Preambulatory:

<u>Bearing in mind</u> that piracy is a complicated and deep international issue that requires a long-term and permanent solution

<u>Alarmed</u> by the number of pirate attacks that happened in the region in the last decade (around 859)

<u>Having considered</u> the fact that Corrupt individuals may be funding and protecting those pirates

<u>Alarmed</u> by the long continuation of piracy in the Gulf of Guinea

Recognizing economic instability and low social safety as a leading cause of piracy

Operative:

- 1. <u>Requests</u> the deployment of UN patrol boats in the Gulf of Guinea
- 2. <u>Draws attention</u> to the possibility of corruption within governments and companies
 - a. Requests GOG Countries to crack down on their high-ranking officials
 - b. Requests GOG Countries to crack down on corrupt companies responsible for docking ships
- 3. <u>Requests</u> more just punishments for pirates caught attacking ships in the GOG such as
 - a. Up to a life sentence in high-security prisons
 - *i.* For those involved with pirate attacks
 - ii. For those who indirectly supported the attacks
- 4. <u>Requests</u> the creation of the Bureau of Anti-Piracy (BAP)
 - a. All countries in agreement with the dangers of piracy will be a part of this council
 - i. This council will ensure any solutions made here today are maintained and are withheld
 - ii. Annual meetings will be held to constantly discuss the issue
 - iii. This council will s upport combating piracy in the Gulf of Guinea
- 5. <u>Calls</u> for the creation of a fund that supports countries in the Gulf of Guinea with things such as:
 - a. Training their navy
 - b. Providing weapons and vessels
 - c. Recruit more soldiers
 - d. Cracking down on corrupt officials
 - e. Strengthening their special operations teams to crack down on maritime kidnapping cases
- 6. <u>Requests</u> the deployment of armed UN peacekeepers on high-risk targets
- 7. <u>Calling on all countries</u> within the Gulf Of Guinea to cooperate with each other by
 - a. Allowing docking rights for the 13 countries in the GoG
 - b. Cooperative training sessions with others
 - c. Sharing information about piracy with each other
- 8. <u>Asks</u> for all CMF members, available, to lend 4% of their naval vessels on a rotating basis of 4 months to the Bureau of Anti Piracy (BAP)
- 9. Affirms that pirates who cooperate with officials and provide intel and information will
 - a. Have a reduced sentence
 - b. Be protected by the government
 - c. Be rewarded with a financial amount

- 9. <u>Calls upon</u> countries of the UN to financially support citizens in order to
 - a. Reinforce public safety
 - b. Stabilize economic conditions
