The UPSOM Department of Emergency Medicine (EM) invites you to explore our Summer Research/Clinical Immersion (SRI) program that provides medical students with a diverse, structured 2 month-long in-person experience in the Department of Emergency Medicine.

Funding is available through NIH and local foundation grants focused on Underrepresented in Medicine (URiM) learners, however funded spots are limited.

We particularly encourage students from backgrounds URiM to apply.

Components of Program:

Summer Research Project:

 Each SRI student will undertake a mentored research project as the core of the summer experience. Sample student project themes:
 Family dynamics after cardiac arrest
 Cardiac arrest survivorship
 Quality Improvement in post-arrest care

2. Workshops:

Workshops focused on core EM skills are offered. The SRI program will provide all necessary materials. Previous workshops have included:

Airway CPR Suture/splinting Wilderness medicine Bleeding and immobilization

3. Summer Didactic Series:

SRI students attend weekly remote 'Journal Club' conferences and lectures, all led by EM faculty. During Journal Club, students will learn to assess medical literature and present their research to colleagues via completing a poster. Students will also have the opportunity to shadow EM, ICU, and/or EMS physicians.
