Written between 150-250 words, italicized in two languages, namely Indonesian and English. An abstract is not a summary consisting of several paragraphs. The content of the abstract includes the purpose of the study, data / object of study, methods, results or conclusions.

This section describes the research design, scope or object (population and sample), data collection techniques, operational definitions of research variables, and analysis techniques.

4. Results and Discussion

This section presents the results of the research analysis. Research analysis can be supplemented by tables, graphs (images), and/or charts. The discussion section describes the results of data processing, interprets the findings logically, and relates to relevant reference sources.

Each table is written without a vertical line and is equipped with a source of years of processing research data. The image or graphics are at least clearly displayed and readable. Tables, images and graphs are placed at the top or bottom with the title placed above for the table and placed below for left-aligned images and graphs. Avoid explaining tables and images by using the words "Table above, figure below, Table following, etc" but mention the table clearly using names such as Table 1, Figure 2, etc. The wording Table 1, Figure 2 should be bolded.




Figure 1. Panel Data Model Selection Techniques
