



## Instructions on How to use the Resources:

## **Drug Information**

- UpToDate LexiDrug comprehensive drug information including monographs, interactions checker, and information for special populations.
- <u>CPS</u> online access to the CPS and Therapeutic Choices.

#### **Evidence-Based Practice Resources**

• <u>DynaMed</u> - evidence-based summaries of diseases and drugs.

#### **Natural Products**

 <u>NatMed Pro</u> (formerly called Natural Medicines) - resource on dietary supplements, natural medicines, and complementary alternative and integrative therapies.

#### **Article Databases**

- <u>PubMed</u> database for identifying journal article literature (access to UofA e-journal subscriptions).
- MEDLINE (via Ovid) includes PubMed content but designed for comprehensive literature searching (advanced searching)
- Embase "European equivalent to PubMed." Includes European content not found in PubMed with a speciality to drug literature.
