- 1. "Advocacy & Listening": Incorporating and streamlining student feedback.
 - I. Remove <u>barriers</u>¹ around Alumni Park and collect feedback from students regarding <u>the campus check-in system</u>².

- II. **Reinvigorate** large-scale <u>Programming events</u>³ like Concerts, Festivals, and Speakers by negotiating with talent agencies to bring well-known artists and influential figures.
- III. **Enter** into discussions to introduce ChatGPT Edu⁴ into USC, like UPenn Wharton⁵.
- IV. **Develop** dialogues with Hospitality to create permanent, customized stations at all <u>the dining</u> <u>halls</u>⁶ with a new system of <u>more flexible and partial meal plans</u>⁷ different from the current ones offered.
- V. **Implement** <u>Laundry Stipends</u>⁸ for students in USC housing.
- VI. **Create** special discounts for RSOs to <u>rent large on-campus venues</u> ⁹like the Grand Ballroom and Tommy's Place at lower prices.
- VII. **Empower** <u>international students</u>¹⁰ by hosting semesterly Career Fairs exclusive to applicants with F1 VISAs.
- VIII. **Introduce** "Know Your Rights" legal workshops to navigate federal policies on housing & tenant protections 12, Financial Aid, LGBTQIA+ health care resources 13, global visa processing 14 & employment restriction.
 - IX. **Coordinate** with service RSOs to organize more volunteering opportunities around LA.
- 2. <u>"Action & Leadership":</u> Improving USG's efficiency by working with pre-existing groups to tackle similar goals and simplify bureaucratic hurdles.

- I. **Open up** more RestSC¹⁵ spaces in *Doheny, Leavey*, and *Fertitta* with designated bean bags and napping cushions.
- II. **Widen** the scale and frequency of <u>Tommy's Closet</u>¹⁶ drives for free professional & casual clothes.
- III. Integrate EBT^{17} to *Seeds* to increase accessible options.
- IV. **Collaborate** with Campus Activities to ensure student groups can become RSOs every semester.
- V. **Utilize** the new <u>ad hoc commission</u> 18 system to invite non-USG officers to contribute.
- VI. **Expand** <u>late-night studying spots</u>¹⁹ by implementing energy drink and coffee vending machines at libraries and keeping more buildings open.
- VII. **Launch** a new health reimbursement system to subsidize <u>emergency contraceptives</u>²⁰, making the on-demand, immediate resources more affordable.
- VIII. **Work with** <u>Custodial Services</u>²¹ to provide better toiletries/amenities and cleaner bathrooms in the libraries.
- 3. <u>"Accountability & Leveraging"</u>: Fostering equal dynamics between undergraduates and the new administration.
 - I. **Extend** Admin RoundTables²² to RSO leaders, connecting them to converse with their direct parties of interest.
 - II. **Bring in** new <u>foreign language placement exams</u>²³ for graduation requirements, including underrepresented languages such as Farsi, Vietnamese, Turkish, and Hindi-Urdu.
 - III. **Allow** students to gain access to the results of the <u>Learning Experience Evaluations form</u>²⁴ for class registrations.

- IV. **Demand** better registration windows and on-campus housing options for Spring admits and transfers.
- V. **Call for** internal investments and renovations on outdated facilities such as *Kaprielian* and *Taper*.
- VI. **Formulate** a Financial Aid Advisory Committee, composed of faculty, students, and admin to demand financial transparency surrounding <u>tuition</u>²⁵ increases.
- 4. <u>"Aligning & Leaning":</u> Requesting access to essential resources and accommodating broader student interests.
 - VII. **Destigmatize** mental well-being programs by working with organizations such as the *Crisis*Text Line²⁶ to provide support and intervention.
 - VIII. **Elevate** USC's presence in the Big Ten Conference by promoting better turnout at athletic games and strengthening our connection to other national <u>networks</u>²⁷.
 - IX. **Urge** the City Council to repair the broken and cracked sidewalks in residential areas for <u>safer</u> streets²⁸.
 - X. **Continue to foster** long-term partnerships with stakeholders such as <u>Daily Trojan</u>²⁹, helping them find stable funding sources.
