	February 1 Apply on or before this date in order to receive equal consideration for admission to programs starting the following fall. After this date, colleges consider applicants on a first-come, first-served basis until programs are full.
	Note that applications to Highly Competitive Programs must be received by this date in order to be considered.
	Applicants are encouraged to complete their applications well before the Equal Consideration Date, as website volumes on the online application are at their highest at this time.
	Many programs continue to accept applicants after February 1. Use our <u>Find a Program</u> tool at any time to find programs that are still open.
February	Mid February Login and check your OCAS account semester 1 final grades. Report any missing or inaccurate grades after this date to your guidance contact. OCAS reports all grade 9-12 marks.
April	Prior to this time use the <u>OSAP calculator</u> End of April Login and check your OCAS account semester two midterm grades. Report any missing or inaccurate grades after this date to your guidance contact. OCAS reports all grade 9-12 marks. <u>OSAP Application Opens in late April or May</u>
May	May 1 Applicants must confirm their acceptance of an offer of admission by this date. Log in to your ontariocolleges.ca account to confirm your offer. Colleges may extend offers of admission after this date. Each college will set the deadline to confirm offers made after May 1, and this deadline will be communicated to you with your offer.
June	June 1 Earliest date that colleges may require payment of tuition fees.
