<p>(1) Prerequisite Credential An institution operating a program for the Bilingual Authorization must verify, prior to recommending a candidate for the authorization, that the candidate holds a prerequisite credential or is recommended for a prerequisite credential simultaneously. The prerequisite credential must include an English Learner authorization or the candidate must be eligible for an English Learner authorization pursuant to the provisions of Education Code section 44253.4(b)(1) and 5 California Code of Regulations (CCR) sections 80015.1(a)(1) and 80015.2.</p> <p>Acceptable prerequisite credentials include a valid California teaching credential, services credential(s) with the added special class authorization, visiting faculty permit, child development permit (excluding assistant and associate permit), or children’s center permit which credential or permit authorizes the holder to provide instruction to pupils in preschool, kindergarten, any of grades 1 to 12, inclusive, or classes primarily organized for adults, except for the following: emergency credentials or permits, exchange credentials as specified in Education Code section 44333, district intern credentials as specified in education code section 44325, sojourn certificated employee credentials as specified in Education Code section 44856, and teacher education</p>	<p>At CPP, bilingual teacher candidates can select one of two (2) paths toward the Bilingual Authorization for English + Spanish, Mandarin, or Filipino: the concurrent path and the post-credential path. Concurrent bilingual teacher candidates are required to complete either a Single Subject, or Multiple Subject teaching credential (or the equivalent) as they complete the requirements for the Bilingual Authorization. Post-credential bilingual candidates are admitted to the CPP Bilingual Authorization program only if they possess a valid teaching credential with the English learner authorization (Single Subject, Multiple Subject or an equivalent). Supports teacher candidates in developing culturally responsive teacher dispositions. Introduces sociolinguistic principles of effective pedagogies for English learners. Multiple and Single Subject candidates deepen their knowledge of theory and strategies developing English Language skills, including reading, among all pupils, including those for whom English is a second language, in accordance with the Commission's standards in EDU 5100 (MS) or EDU 5200 (MS). These courses also include the new Literacy TPEs.</p> <p data-bbox="1060 1003 1892 1416">Multiple Subject EDU 5100 - Introduction to Literacy Instruction (3) (docx) Theoretical models and pedagogical applications of literacy acquisition for native English speakers and English language learners. Emergent literacy, structure of language,</p>

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	<p>phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, comprehension, spelling and literacy assessment. 20 hours field experience.</p> <p>Multiple Subject EDU 5105 - Language Arts, Second Language Acquisition, and Children's Literature (3) (.docx) Theoretical models and pedagogical applications of language arts, writing and second language acquisition for native English speakers and English language learners. Investigation of genres, authors, illustrators and diversity in children's literature.</p> <p>Single Subject EDU 5200 Secondary Reading and Writing in the Content Areas (3) (.docx) Examination of the roles that reading and writing play in learning. Examine the cognitive and socio-cultural characteristics shared by the reading and writing processes. The course includes 20 hours of fieldwork related to course content. Secondary school educators have long been concerned with the possibilities and challenges of teaching youth in a rapidly evolving world. Literacy is the foundation of the secondary curriculum, yet it is often assumed that the sole responsibility for intentional literacy instruction rests with English teachers. Many content-area instructors do not explicitly teach the language of their particular discipline to students, assuming that students enter their classroom with the necessary preparation to succeed as a reader and writer in their coursework. However, the concept of disciplinary literacy has also recently become the focus of considerable national interest by many educational researchers, professional organizations, and policymakers.</p>
