Santa Clara County Office of Education (SCCOE) Differentiated Assistance Technical Assistance Model 2022-23

Part I: 2022 Differentiated Assistance Eligibility Criteria

California is required to resume the identification of local educational agencies (LEAs) for support and differentiated assistance with the release of the 2022 California Dashboard in December. Assembly Bill (AB) 130 (Chapter 44, Statutes of 2021) limits reporting to *only the status levels* (one year of data) for the 2022 Dashboard state indicators, necessitating a change in Differentiated Assistance (DA) eligibility criteria for 2022.

Based on the limitations specified in AB 130, California Department of Education (CDE) recommended eligibility criteria for DA identification in December of 2022. The State Board of Education (SBE) approved DA identification (image right) at the September 2022 SBE meeting. The criteria is based on status only. LEAs are identified as eligible if at least one student group meets the criteria in two or more different LCFF state priority areas. (Click here for larger image.)

Part II: SCCOE's 2022-23 DA Technical Support Model

For any school district meeting the eligibility criteria for DA, the county superintendent of schools shall provide technical assistance focused on building the school district's capacity to develop and implement actions and services responsive to pupil and community needs, pursuant EC - 52071. *


DA Technical assistance with COEs includes:

- 1. assisting the LEA to identify its strengths and weaknesses in regard to the state priorities [as described in subdivision (d) of EC Section 52060]; ©
- 2. working collaboratively with the school district to identify and implement effective programs and practices to address any areas of weakness:
- 3. obtaining from the school district timely documentation demonstrating that it has completed the activities described in items (1) and (2); and
- 4. Requesting that the California Collaborative for Educational Excellence provide advice and assistance to the school district, pursuant to subdivision (g) of Section 52074
- 5. assisting LEAs to identify to review performance data on the state and local indicators included in the California School Dashboard and other relevant local data, and to identify effective, evidence-based programs or practices that address any areas of weakness and continuous improvement

In an effort to effectively support LEAs eligible for technical assistance, SCCOE's Continuous Improvement & Accountability (CIA) will be utilizing a hybrid model. (See details in the table below.) The new model will bring DA eligible LEAs together to provide opportunities for cross-county networking and collaboration, while still providing personalized technical assistance from the CIA Team.

It leads a set of processes that articulates the problem to be solved, analyzes the system that produces current undesirable outcomes, and develops the aim statement and an initial working theory of practice improvement. The initiation team also takes the lead in securing the necessary support for the network (both political as well as material), recruiting initial members into the community, and engaging the academic and technical expertise relevant to the specific problem to be solved.
