WHAT IS INTERACT?

Interact is the teen branch of Rotary International, open to students aged 12-18. Interactors focus on promoting international understanding and gaining leadership skills and personal integrity. While doing this, they also collaborate with Rotarians, Rotaractors, middle school Interactors, and other Interactors to positively impact the world.



What is Interact 5170? We are the largest and most effective Interact District in the world. With over 4,500 members from over 110 clubs spanning 4 counties (Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, San Benito, and Alameda), Interact 5170, over the past nine years, has been able to raise over \$1,000,000 towards its International Projects³, as well as contribute over 300,000 hours of service centered around our Community Projects⁴. We, Interact 5170, are to look back on what has shaped us, and remember not only why we have joined but why we have stayed, bound together through cycles of service and love. This year, we will Be the Beacon of service by providing opportunities to engage community members in efforts to give back to those around us--Be the Beacon (2026-2027 Interact 5170 Theme).

Interact 5170 unifies the 150+ clubs in our district with a Theme and Goals adopted by a 26-member student District Council with Area Directors serving as the connection between clubs and the District. We are guided by a team of advisors and the District Chair who helps oversee logistics and maintain our connection to Rotary International.

Why start an Interact club?

There are many benefits for an Interact club:

- ★ Develops career-ready leadership, project governance, and social responsibility in students.
- ★ Fosters meaningful peer networks and mentorship opportunities with local business and civic leaders.
- ★ Provides access to district-wide leadership summits¹, hands-on service initiatives², and keynotes, such as our large-scale district event, the Fall Leadership Conference, in which Interactors from across the district come together and take away essential leadership experiences through keynote speakers, workshops, and a hands-on service project.

8 STEPS

TO START AN INTERACT CLUB (HIGH SCHOOL, MIDDLE SCHOOL, OR COMMUNITY).
*COMMUNITY CLUBS MAY SKIP STEPS 1 & 3.

STEP 1: CHECK WITH YOUR SCHOOL

Make sure the school administration approves of a service club, and that there isn't an inactive Interact club already in your school that needs to be revived.

STEP 2: GATHER YOUR OFFICERS

Look to [Pg. 6](#) for your Executive Leadership Team (President, Secretary, and Treasurer). You may opt to find more officers and extend your board, but the three listed are required to begin your club. Officers must be of ages 12-18 years old. Officers should serve with the same passion and dedication to the club.

STEP 3: FIND A FACULTY ADVISOR

Look for a faculty member that is willing to offer their classroom for general meetings when possible during lunch and board/officer meetings after school (the faculty advisor must be present at meetings). STEP 4: FIND A ROTARY ADVISOR

Rotary International requires that every Interact club has a sponsoring Rotary club to help guide and support the Interact club. Contact the Outreach Coordinators to help find Rotary clubs near your school to sponsor your club at: outreach@interact5170.org.

STEP 5: FILL OUT THE FORM

There is a total of 3 forms to complete:

- Link to fill out the online Club Certification form here: [Club Certification](#)
- Adopt and fill out the Interact Club Constitution: [Club Constitution](#)
- By-Laws: [By-Laws](#)

You must complete and submit the online Club Certification form as well as the Constitution and By-Laws. Make sure to notify outreach@interact5170.org with the subject line [name of school - chartering forms] so the District Council can assist and track your progress. We would recommend completing these forms along with your sponsoring Rotary Club.

STEP 6: FOLLOW-UP

The process is as follows:

1. Once submitted, the online form automatically routes to your sponsoring Rotary Club President and Rotary District Governor for digital signatures and processing through Rotary International.
2. Once processed by Rotary International, an official congratulations email and digital charter certificate will automatically be sent to the Rotary Club President and Advisor. Rotary International will also notify the District Council of your official certification.
3. That's it! Plan a chartering party to celebrate! (See next steps.)

While you are forming your club, you likely will already have been assigned and worked with your Interact 5170 District Council Area Director. Contact outreach@interact5170.org to confirm your certification and participation in Area meetings and events.

STEP 7: CONGRATULATIONS!

Congratulations! You are now an officially chartered Interact club of District 5170! Plan accordingly with your officers/board members, faculty advisor, Rotary advisor, and Area Director to put together a general plan for your club, including gathering members. Planning and laying out a road is key for your club's success! In celebration of becoming an officially chartered club, look into planning a kick-off event for your club!

STEP 8: CELEBRATE!

You are an officially chartered Interact Club in our District and now have a team! This is a big deal, and you should be proud to have taken the first step to strengthen service values in your community and school. And if you still need help, let us know at outreach@interact5170.org and visit rotary.org! This is where your story begins, so throw a kickoff event to celebrate!

OFFICER POSITIONS

Keep in mind some of these are suggestions! Every home club is unique, so we recommend talking to your advisors and Area Director about which positions would benefit your club most! Additional positions may be added at the chartering board's discretion! This is only if you need help getting started!

EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP TEAM

PRESIDENT

Runs weekly meetings at school. Communicates with officers, board members, the Area Director, and advisors to plan big events. Attends area meetings and communicates area events and information to the club. Acts as a liaison between the school club and District Council in reporting community service hours and fundraising money. Ensures the club is run in an upbeat, effective, and cooperative manner. Exemplifies what Interact Club stands for. Larger clubs may have a President and Vice-Presidents or Co-Presidents.

SECRETARY

Keeps track of all hours completed by the club members. Takes notes at all meetings and later sends them to the President and other officers. Writes the general meeting agendas in coordination with the President. Larger clubs may have two or more secretaries, depending on the workload.

TREASURER

Keeps track of all club funds. Knows what the running balance of the club's account is. Collects, deposits, reimburses, and withdraws money for club purposes. Helps set S.M.A.R.T. (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, Timely) goals for fundraising within the club.

OPTIONAL POSITIONS

PUBLICIST

Is tech savvy (especially with computers and graphic design). Responsibilities include but are not limited to designing posters/flyers, daily morning announcements, club website updates, designing awards/certificates, etc.

HISTORIAN

Attends most events to take pictures. If needed, update the school's club website by uploading pictures of events. Sends photos and descriptions of events to the Area Director for publication in the district newsletter and on the district site.

EVENTS

The duties of an Interact Events Coordinator include but are not limited to: looking for local community service/fundraising events for the school to participate in, assigning roles and responsibilities for event management, working with the President and Area Director to plan future events, and collaborating with the club to ensure maximum attendance at district and area events.

OUTREACH COORDINATOR

Works closely to reach out to different fundraisers and organizations to start their home clubs. Assisting event coordinators in the logistics of any events as well! Can also serve as a liaison between middle schools in the area to help guide them through their own clubs/encourage them to join and interact when they are in high school!

CHECKLIST

- ❑ Talk with school administrators to ask permission to start your Interact club. (for school-based clubs)
- ❑ Recruit a team of reliable and passionate officers to help your club flourish.
- ❑ Look for teachers who are willing to advise the club.
 - ❑ Select the best-fitting teacher who is enthusiastic about Interact and has a schedule that enables you to use their classroom for meetings.
 - ❑ Allow them to understand Interact through this: [Interact Guide for Advisors](#)
- ❑ Contact the Outreach Coordinators (outreach@interact5170.org) to find a Rotary club to sponsor your Interact club. If you don't know which Area you are in, the Outreach team will reply and loop in the respective Area Director so you can start coordinating together.

- ❑ Work with your sponsoring Rotary club to complete the online form found here: [Interact Form](#)
 - ❑ Ensure the online form is submitted so it routes to your Rotary advisor/club president and District Governor for signatures.
- ❑ Make sure to look over and adopt the Interact Constitution and By-Laws found at: (<https://tinyurl.com/656constitution>) and (<https://tinyurl.com/657bylaws>)
 - ❑ Send confirmation to outreach@interact5170.org.
- ❑ Contact your Area Director through email to arrange a meeting with them.
- ❑ Create a calendar with events you would like to hold throughout the year. Consult your officer team and faculty advisor.
- ❑ Meet with your officer team, faculty advisor, and Rotary advisor to solidify these plans to have a set outline for your club.
- ❑ Congratulations! Your club is chartered! If your chartering is completed by May, coordinate with the corresponding Area Director and the Outreach Team to be recognized and celebrated at District Sunset and the Rotary District Conference.

APPENDIX

1. **New Presidents' Meeting:** Event where presidents from all across the district meet to learn valuable frameworks and tips to better improve their own meetings and service events.

Fall Leadership Conference: Students from across the Bay Area come together to develop leadership skills with workshops. This opportunity is targeted towards Interactors in leadership positions.

Interact Fall Rally: A spirit event to share Interact's upcoming International and Community Projects along with a celebration of area competitions.

President's Winter Retreat: A two-day long leadership retreat taken place over President's weekend. Individuals get to learn different leadership skills such as how to communicate and work with the team, and also how to lead one.

2. **2025-2026 Service Initiatives:**

Project Hello: The project focuses on local homelessness support. Interactors are partnering with the Open Heart Kitchen non-profit to build and distribute 1,000 supply kits and log over 5,000 hours of volunteer service.

Interact Fall Rally Workshops: Interactors were able to help assemble care kits to be distributed to the communities in need throughout the Bay Area as one of the workshop rotations at Fall Rally.

3. **International Projects** Examples: The Ripple Effect, Foster our Future, Heartbeats of Hope, Harvesting Hope

Purpose: Promoting global understanding, peace, and tangible humanitarian aid by uniting youth to solve worldwide issues.

4. **Community Projects** Examples: Plant the Seed, Ignite Ambition, Project Hello

Purpose: Strengthening local neighborhoods and empowering youth to take direct action on pressing community challenges, including mental health awareness, food insecurity, environmental sustainability, and support for vulnerable populations. Our projects change every year!
