Yunus Arikan, ICLEI Director of Global Advocacy and LGMA Focal Point, recaps the latest from COP30's final stretch. New texts on just transition, adaptation, and mitigation were released on 21 November, with talks ongoing and outcomes still uncertain. But Belém is already signaling a new era of implementation as the process moves toward COP31 and COP32.

LGMA COP30 Closing Plenary Statement: "The goal to make this the COP of Truth was the right one — but the target was not reached fully."

On 22 November, the final day of COP30, the LGMA Constituency commended the COP30 Presidency, welcoming progress on the Mutirão text on cities and multilevel climate action, stronger references to multilevel approaches in mitigation and adaptation, and the creation of a Just Transition Mechanism. However, "Not putting the implementers at the heart of the Belém

Package slows the pace of national transitions at precisely the moment when we need it to accelerate," said Yunus Arikan, LGMA Focal Point.

Looking ahead, the LGMA looks forward to working with the COP30 Presidency and all other nations and partners to advance implementation toward the IPCC Special Report on Cities in 2027.

Negotiations update

Press conference on multilevel cooperation for stronger COP outcomes

As we wait for new draft decisions to come from the COP Presidency today, Mayors and networks joined together for a press conference to emphasize the importance of the LGMA proposal being taken up in the draft outcomes. At the C40-organized press conference Eric Garcetti, Ambassador for Global Climate Diplomacy at C40 Cities, former Mayor of Los Angeles and US Ambassador to India and Mayor Mohamed Sefiani of Chefchaouen, Morocco, ICLEI Vice President and GCoM Regional Ambassador, were joined by Caterina Sarfatti, C40 Cities COP30 Head of Delegation, Yunus Arikan – Director of Global Advocacy at ICLEI, and LGMA focal point, and Champa Patel, Executive Director for Governments and Policy at Climate Group, made the case in COP30's final stretch, urging for formal recognition of multilevel governance and urbanization.

Following subnational leaders meeting with President Lula late on 19 November, and as COP30 reaches a crunch point, mayors and local leaders held the press conference to call on the COP30 Presidency to ensure formal recognition of subnational governments in the outcomes, to truly reflect a global Mutirão Decision. Subnational implementation has been advancing for decades; now a formalized dialogue is needed to leverage and reflect these contributions within the UN process.

President Lula yesterday had a closed meeting with Indigenous people, youth, business and subnational leaders. Representatives included Jader Barbalho Filho, Brazil Minister for Cities; Silvio Barros, Mayor of Maringá, Brazil; José Renato Ogawa Rodrigues, Mayor of Bacarena, Brazil; Luziane de Lima Solon Oliveira, Mayor of Benevides, Brazil; and Mohamed Sefiani, Mayor of Chefchaouen, Morocco. Mayor Sefiani spoke on behalf of the LGMA and communicated LGMA's proposals to the President. Later the <u>outcomes of the Local Leaders Forum</u> in Rio were presented.

LGMA to Parties: "This will not be the COP of Implementation without the implementers at the heart of it."

On 19 November, at the Global Climate Action High-Level Closing Event - convened by the Climate High-Level Champions, the COP29 and COP30 Presidents, and the UNFCCC Executive Secretary - Carlos de Freitas, from FMDV – Global Fund for Cities Development, speaking for the Constituency, commended progress made but stressed that the current text reinforces the status quo and fails to move subnationals towards implementation. Negotiations update

With the finish line in sight, LGMA works to land a favorable negotiated outcome

The push to move from negotiation to implementation at COP30 has led to the strongest recognition of our work inside the negotiations in years.

On Tuesday, the COP30 Presidency released several draft documents of interest to the Constituency, including the "Mutirão" decision takes up the four big issues that, although not formally on the agenda, have been dominant in negotiations discussions, including emissions-cutting ambition, countries' climate plans, climate finance and trade.

LGMA delegates are pushing for an outcome in this document that could move the dial on our inclusion into the formal processes of COP. Our goal is these negotiations mandate a process that includes subnational governments because truly effective climate action is action taken in coordination across different levels of government.

By end of the day Tuesday 18 November, the Constituency was working to land textual suggestions into a revised version of this decision.

The situation is rapidly evolving. The revised text will land sometime this morning Brazilian time, with Brazil President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva set to arrive back at the Summit.

By the time COP30 opened in Belém, this architecture was no longer just an idea. It had become a working mechanism with regular exchanges throughout the year, shared agendas and a growing sense of collective ownership.

Negotiations update

Quick action needed from LGMA Constituents today

At the COP30 Presidency informal consultations on 14 November Friday, the COP30 Presidency invited Parties and stakeholders to submit their views by 11:00 Brazil time on Sat 15 November, where a specific discussion on "Responding to urgency, accelerating implementation, solidarity and international cooperation" is expected. We encourage all LGMA partners to reach to relevant contacts or UNFCCC national focal points so that they can also make submissions to include our text (as follows):

"Requests the [COP Presidency / Secretariat], in collaboration with the LGMA constituency, to convene a mandated dialogue on multilevel governance and urbanisation, through in-session workshops in conjunction with UNFCCC sessions to accelerate implementation at local and subnational levels and to close the ambition gap, and requests the Secretariat to prepare a report of the discussions by COP32, to facilitate the UNFCCC response to the IPCC Special Report on Cities due in 2027 and as an input to the Second Global Stocktake in 2028."

The below option can also be considered as a shortened version; "Convene a mandated dialogue on multilevel governance and urbanisation, culminating at COP32, to accelerate implementation at local and subnational levels and close the ambition gap."

Finance Your Cities Country Platforms for Localizing Finance take center stage at COP30 ahead of GCF session

At COP30, FMDV, the AMUF Alliance of African Ministers for Urbanization Financing, and the Global Alliance of Subnational Development Banks (SDBs) brought global attention to the <u>Finance Your Cities (FYC) Country Platforms for Localizing Finance (CPLFs)</u>, highlighting them as a new generation of national systems that embed local and regional governments, mobilize SDBs, and create investable pipelines for territorial climate action. Dan loschpe, COP30 High-level Climate Champion also spoke at the session.

These outcomes align closely with the Green Climate Fund's new Locally Led Climate Action (LLCA) Guidelines and precede the GCF's hosting the launch of over 15 country platforms, with FMDV and its alliances preparing to present additional champion countries ready to adopt the CPLF formula.

LGMA makes the case for multilevel governance and urbanization at the COP30 President's Townhall Meeting

On 14 November, at COP30 President's Townhall Meeting with Observers the LGMA called on Parties to secure a strong legacy of multilevel governance and urbanization by formally mandating a dialogue that involved subnational and local governments in the UNFCCC process. "This ask represents an offer and opportunity for partnership – by supporting this dialogue, we can turn your vision of unity across all levels of government into a more sustainable and

As negotiations continue to unfold at COP30, the LGMA Constituency has coalesced around a request to Parties to take up proposed text to include a legacy of multilevel governance and urbanization. Constituency members are encouraged to reach out to Party representatives with this proposed text.

This means that the outcomes of COP30 Cities Day are now being translated into the negotiations through two complementary processes. We propose that the text be incorporated into COP30 negotiations on NDCs, and it can be customized for global stocktake, just transition and adaptation, and other agendas as appropriate. Additionally, the COP30 Presidency, Brazil's Ministry of Cities, UNFCCC and UN-Habitat have jointly released the Summary of the Chair for the Fourth Ministerial Meeting for Urbanization and Climate Change (PDF) which will be circulated to Parties.

Subnational call to action: Accelerate the just transition away from fossil fuels

Under2 Coalition Secretariat – Climate Group issued a call for COP30 to advance multilateral progress on the single biggest driver of climate impacts: Fossil fuels. Building on the inaugural COP28 commitment to a planned transition away from fossil fuels, Parties should now move from principle to practice. The Statement has been endorsed by all four Co-Chairs of the Under2 Coalition: the Scottish Government, United Kingdom; Chungcheongnam-do Province Government, Republic of Korea; Western Cape Government, South Africa; and the Government of the State of Querétaro, Mexico.

Since the launch of the pilots in Cameroon and Madagascar earlier this year, FYC CPLFs have already mobilized USD 1 million for readiness and USD 10.6 million for project design, feasibility, and implementation, with **71 local and regional governments** already engaged in prioritizing pipelines for resilient infrastructure, focusing on projects such as coastal resilience, reforestation, waste management, and flood-risk reduction.



Cities take the spotlight at COP30's Urban Day at the Ministerial Meeting on Urbanization and Climate Change

On 11 November, the fourth Ministerial Meeting on Urbanization and Climate Change brought together ministers, mayors, governors, and partners to accelerate climate action in cities and regions.

The high-level plenary marked the close of COP30's Urban days and delivered clear outcomes: Commitments to localize NDCs, scale up finance, strengthen multilevel governance, and act on urban heat, housing, and nature.

UN-Habitat also released <u>new analysis showing that the number of national climate plans (NDC 3.0) with strong urban content has nearly doubled</u> - signalling a global shift from planning to implementation in cities.

Ms. Katrin Stjernfeldt Jammeh, Mayor of Malmö, Sweden and President, ICLEI – Local Governments for Sustainability delivered the <u>intervention</u> at the Ministerial on behalf of the LGMA Constituency.

While the day's press conference was cancelled due to a temporary building evacuation, the message of the day was clear: Cities and regions are essential to delivering climate goals.

According to Simon Stiell, Executive Secretary of the UNFCCC: "CHAMP must now become part of how every country prepares and implements its climate plan – aligning national vision with local execution...National governments commit to big infrastructure projects but local leaders want to see shovels in the ground."

Not the LLF



Let me begin by commending and congratulating the people and governments of the City of Belém, State of Pará, and Brazil, for their hospitality and professionalism in hosting COP30 in Amazonia - and particularly Ambassador André Corrêa do Lago for his passion, wisdom and leadership as well as countless colleagues in the whole COP30 Presidency team.

Thousands of local and regional leaders and their networks who came to Brazil for the Local Leaders Forum in Rio and COP30 in Belém responded to the call for an implementation COP.

The outcomes of the 4th Urbanization and Climate Ministerial elevated our collaboration with national governments.

We have felt genuine recognition for the importance of local action, multilevel cooperation and urbanization through the ministerials, progress on Action Agenda and through numerous parties calling for a mandated dialogue.

Cities, states and regions will continue to lead transitioning away from fossil fuels and confronting the realities of climate impacts, but they need support to further scale up their actions.

The Mutirão text "Cities and other subnational authorities in multilevel climate action" presents a valuable basis to advance multilevel action and urbanization achievements beyond Belém. We also note increasing references to multilevel action in Mitigation Work Programme, and Adaptation.

We warmly welcome the creation of a Just Transition Mechanism in Belém. And we stand ready to contribute to it.

Yet we need to go further than recognition and references. Not putting the implementers at the heart of the Belém Package slows the pace of national transitions at precisely the moment when we need it to accelerate.

The goal to make this the COP of Truth was the right one — but the target was not reached fully. The work of cities, states and regions demonstrate that there is no better way to close the ambition gap.

Many examples of multilevel NDCs 3.0 give us hope beyond Belém. We look forward to working with the COP30 Presidency and all other nations and partners to implement the outcomes of COP30 by putting multilevel action and urbanization at the service of global climate implementation, in particular towards the outcomes of IPCC Special Report on Cities in 2027.
