### Abstract

**Design/Methodology/Approach:** State the article's design/methodology/approach used in the paper.

**Findings:** Present the article's findings based on the analysis and discussion done in the paper.

**Paper Type:** Research Article or General Review

**Keywords:** List the article's 3-5 keywords using the semicolons (;) to separate between one word to another.

Note: The total of word accounts in abstract should not more than 300 words

### Introduction

The introduction should be clear and provide the issue to be discussed in the manuscript. Before the objective, authors should provide an adequate background, and very short literature survey in order to record the existing solutions, to show which is the best of previous researches, to show the main limitation of the previous researches, to show what do you hope to achieve (to solve the limitation), and to show the scientific merit or novelties of the paper.

At the end of the paragraph, the author/s should end with a comment on the significance concerning the identification of the issue and objective of the research.

### Methodology

The method is optional for original research articles. This method is written in descriptive and should provide a statement regarding the methodology of the research. This method as much as possible to give an idea to the reader through the methods

used. This Method is optional, only for original research articles. It is not necessary to add methodology in General Review type of paper.

**Results and Discussion**

This section is the most important section of your article. The analysis or results of the research should be clear and concise. The results should summarize (scientific) findings rather than providing data in great detail. Please highlight differences between your results or findings and the previous publications by other researchers.

**The subheading of The Analysis and Results**

Following the main headings should be bold and underlined texts.

***Sub-Subheading of the Analysis and Results***

Following subheadings should be bold and italic.

Positioning Figures and Tables: Place figures and tables at the top and bottom of columns. Avoid placing them in the middle of columns. Large figures and tables may span across both columns. Figure captions should be below the figures; table heads should appear above the tables. Insert figures and tables after they are cited in the text. Use the abbreviation "Fig. 1," even at the beginning of a sentence.

The conclusion contains a description that should answer the objectives of the research. Provide a clear and concise conclusion. Do not repeat the Abstract or describe the results of the research. Give a clear explanation regarding the possible application and suggestions related to the research findings.

**Acknowledgment**

The preferred spelling of the word "acknowledgment" in America is without an "e" after the "g." Avoid the stilted expression "one of us (R. B. G.) thanks ...". Instead, try "R. B. G. thanks...". Put sponsor acknowledgments in the unnumbered footnote on the first page.

**References**

The minimum references are 15, and it must be based on 90% journals and 10% of books published in the last ten years. The citation style of the manuscript should be written in APA (American Psychological Association) both in the body text and

references. Cite only items that you have read and on footnotes. Please use Reference Manager Applications like EndNote, Mendeley, Zotero, etc. All publications cited in the text should be included as a list of Bibliography, arranged alphabetically by author.

**Supplementary Material**

Supplementary material that may be helpful in the review process should be prepared and provided as a separate electronic file. That file can then be transformed into PDF format and submitted along with the manuscript and graphic files to the appropriate editorial office.
