**Recalling** the unprecedented and unjustified aggression and military action started by the Russian Federation in Ukraine, which violates article 2 (4) of the Charter of the United Nations, and

**Realizing** that the purchase of Russian oil and natural gas in the current circumstances is comparable to supporting Russian aggression, and

**Observing** the Russian Federation's increasing threat to global energy markets and democratic stability in general, and

**Aware that** one of the United Nations' main goals is the maintenance of global peace and the development of friendly relations between states and increased trust in democracy, respect and protection of human rights and human dignity, and the rule of law, and

**Whereas** the United Nations and the entire world now face an unprecedented challenge resulting from the Russian Federation's fragrant violation of human rights and democratic stability, and

**Affirming** its strongest condemnation of the aggressor state's unjustified military action against a sovereign state of the United Nations and noting that this poses a threat of nuclear weapons,

**Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**

1. Endorses the formation by states acting through or in cooperation with each other and the European Union (EU) of the Southern Stream Coalition in order to diversify gas supplies to the EU and neighboring states and in order to protect human rights, the rule of law, and democracy.
2. Acknowledges that this project will help establish stronger relationships and constructive ties between the states involved.
3. Appreciates that the Southern Stream Coalition will help certain states by improving security (Israel) and strengthening democracy (Syria).
4. Intensifies its support for developing states.

5. Recognizes that providing workplaces and room for investment will lead to regional and even cross-continental economic growth, political and social stability, and increased respect for human rights and the rule of law and democracy through joint cooperation activity.
6. Acknowledging that purchasing oil and gas from the Russian Federation, an aggressor state, undermines the values of the United Nations and requires securing a viable alternative, with more enduring and reliable partners of gas supplies whilst simultaneously fostering new opportunities for cooperation that promise to stabilize the region and beyond
7. The Southern Stream Coalition seeks to promote and execute the United Nations' duty to establish strong relationships between states and stimulate democratic values.
8. The Southern Stream Coalition will assist Syria in restricting Russian influence over its domestic policy, with a view to democratizing Syria.

**Recalling** the Cold War and how the Soviet Union and the United States almost started a conflict with nuclear weapons but were deterred from doing so out of fear of nuclear fallout, and

**Realizing** that if additional states have access to nuclear weapons technology that the fear of nuclear fallout will increase, thereby deterring the outbreak of nuclear war, and

**Recognizing** that peaceful nuclear energy helps reduce the energy gap and carbon footprint of the world, and

**Observing** the rising threat of nuclear war and the effects of climate change, and

**Aware** that a key purpose of the United Nations is to keep the peace and ensure the overall safety of the world,

**Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**

1. Authorizes states to proliferate nuclear weapons technology.
2. Encourages those states that are able to do so to fund the proliferation of nuclear weapons technology.
3. Recognizes that the proliferation of nuclear weapons technology will enhance deterrence and make the world cleaner.
4. Acknowledges the risks of nuclear technology and a commitment to using all reasonable safeguards.
5. Taking into consideration that jobs will be created and economies will be bolstered.

**Re.:** China's Discrimination against the Uighur Muslims in the Xinjiang

*Whereas* Article 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. They are endowed with reason and conscience and should act towards one another in a spirit of brotherhood.", and

*Whereas* Article 2 section 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, "Everyone is entitled to all the rights and freedoms set forth in this Declaration, without any distinction of any kind, such as race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status.", and

*Whereas* Article 7 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, "All are equal before the law and are entitled without discrimination to equal protection of the law. All are entitled to equal protection against any discrimination in violation of this Declaration and against any incitement to such discrimination.", and

*Recognizing that* the ethnic Uighur group are being held in reeducation camps against their will and disappearing from their families due to their religious affiliations and cultural practices.

*Saddened that* they are being mentally and physically tortured, so that they will renounce their faith and learn Mandarin Chinese.

*Deeply concerned by* the fact that the state is subjecting the minority to biometric collections in order to monitor them and forcing women to take birth control to reduce their population.

*Aware of* the accusations of the Chinese-run organ market and the alleged use of Uighurs as organ donors sourced from these reeducation camps.

### **Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**

1. Start the investigation of the relations between the Chinese government and Uighur ethnic group through starting the Uighur Civil Rights and Ethics Committee (UCREC).
2. Requests that members of the United Nations use their funds to hire, train, and pay people to investigate these human rights violations. Funding equating to \$1,750,000 USD. This will accommodate the training of investigators (approximately 30) around \$1,500,000 in salaries , the transportation and house of them (\$ 200,000), paying guides and resources (\$20,000), and paying for needed supplies (\$5,000) This will be funded through fines being paid if China is found guilty of these reeducation camps by the United Nations. If not found guilty, these funds will be paid back by the accusing united assembly.
3. If there is convincing evidence of this human right violation occurring there would be immediate removal of China from the United Nations Security Council. Paired with the immediate increase in United Nations Peacekeepers and humanitarian aid sent to evaluate the situation.
4. Encourage countries with a recent history of persecuting Shi'a Muslims, including but not limited to Iraq and Iran to back this resolution, as a gesture of amends towards the religious minority.
5. Hopes that countries with a Sunni majority, specifically Turkey, Egypt, and Saudi Arabia will launch a media campaign bringing light to the issue, creating public support for the movement within their countries, along with a Mongolian ethnic majority, specifically Mongolia.
6. The United Nations will start this process within 6 months of being passed, thus not allowing China to dramatically change the conditions upon investigators arrival.
7. This investigation will span 12 months, and will be reevaluated after that time.

*Whereas* Article 3 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “Everyone has the right to life, liberty, and security of person.”, and

*Whereas* Article 25, section 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “Everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and well-being of himself and his family, including food, clothing, housing, and medical care, and necessary social services, and the right to security in the event of unemployment, sickness, disability, widowhood, old age, or other lack of livelihood in circumstances beyond his control.”, and

*Noting that* Albanian gangs are going to France to recruit people for the UK drug trade, and

*Observing* the drug industry is highly dangerous, and

*Recognizing* the Albanian problem has spread to other countries,

**Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**

1. Border security is tightened for imports from countries known to smuggle drugs.
2. We would need a budget of 7 billion US dollars, which will be put into walls at the borders, better checkpoint facilities, recruitment for those protecting against these drug problems, improvement and construction of rehab facilities within the country, and better protection for areas outside of Albania being affected by the Albanian drug crisis.
3. To get this money we would need to raise dues for the 10 highest-paying countries by 1%.

**Re.:** Unemployment, crime, and economic issues in Jamaica

*Whereas* Article 23 section 3 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “Everyone who works has the right to just and favourable remuneration ensuring for himself and his family an existence worthy of human dignity, and supplemented, if necessary, by other means of social protection.”, and

*Whereas* Article 25, section 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “Everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and well-being of himself and his family, including food, clothing, housing, and medical care, and necessary social services, and the right to security in the event of unemployment, sickness, disability, widowhood, old age, or other lack of livelihood in circumstances beyond his control.”, and

*Concerned that* the aftermath of certain weather conditions and COVID-19 has caused high unemployment, public debt, and higher crime rates, and

*Aware that* these recent events have caused a drop from 1.6% to 0.9% in economic growth, more than 17% of the population is below poverty line, and

*Keeping in mind* countries, one being the United States, have provided over \$4 million in assistance to COVID-19 related needs in Jamaica, and

*Aware of the fact* that the high unemployment rate leads to high crimes, including human trafficking and drug trade,

**Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**

1. Provide assistance to help the unemployment rates and debts of citizens of Jamaica due to COVID-19.
2. Provide \$30 million to revitalize and improve existing clinics and hospitals in Jamaica.
3. Provide an initial \$2 million for professional medical training.
4. Provide housing programs to help those in need of adequate living that has been lost due to weather conditions.
5. Request bi-yearly meetings to discuss where Jamaica is financially, until Jamaica’s economy is stabilized.

*Whereas* Article 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights., endowed with reason and conscience and should act towards one another in a spirit of brotherhood.”, and

*Whereas* Article 3 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “Everyone has the right to life, liberty, and security of person.”, and

*Whereas* Article 25, section 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “Everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and well-being of himself and his family, including food, clothing, housing, and medical care, and necessary social services, and the right to security in the event of unemployment, sickness, disability, widowhood, old age, or other lack of livelihood in circumstances beyond his control.”, and

*Alarmed that* a 2021 TIME magazine poll said that the top 10% of wealth in South Africa earn 85% of the money in the country, and

*Shocked that* the difference between the wealthy and poor in South Africa has been increasing steadily since the end of apartheid in 1994, and

*Noting that* most of the top 5% of South African wealth are white men, and the descendants of the wealthy colonizers from the 17th and 19th centuries, and

*Concerned that* a continuation of wealth inequality will decrease affordability and halt economic growth,

**Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**

1. The South African legislature will criminalize racial discrimination.
2. The government will start to provide regulated priced affordable housing for the lower class.
3. By 2024, South Africa will implement a new taxing system to tax an increased percentage to the top 5% of citizens to better help the quality of life.

**Re.:** Civil Discourse Due to the Infringement of Civil Liberties in Vietnam  
**Submitted to:** General Assembly

**Date:** November 19, 2022

**Whereas** Article 2 section 1 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “Everyone is entitled to all the rights and freedoms set forth in this Declaration, without any distinction of any kind, such as race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status.”, and

**Whereas** Article 3 of the UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS states, “Everyone has the right to life, liberty, and security of person.”, and

**Due to** Vietnam’s strict mandate—to ensure protection—during the 2020 and first five months of 2021 COVID-19, it caused civic unrest due to the extend of the power exerted, and

**In the efforts** to “protect” the people, Vietnam initiated excessive force (physical and lawful) to demand compliance, and

**Concerns** with the continuance of the restriction against liberty, for the causation of protection, and

**Ignited** civil discourse toward the conversation of the necessity of these restrictions, and

**However,** Article 117 of the VIETNAMESE PENAL CODES allows the government to criminalize those who are “Making, storing, spreading information, materials, items to oppose the State of Socialist Republic of Vietnam,” and

**Recognizing** the amount of arrests in 2021, consisting of the conviction of at least 32 people for posting critical opinions about the government and sentencing them to prison. Also, police arrested at least 26 other people on charges, and

**Therefore** it’s in Vietnam’s best interest to reconsider the oppression caused by the law and introduce protection toward freedom of expression and speech, and

**Which** diminishes the conflicts and eases the tension between government and civility,

**Be It Hereby Resolved That The General Assembly:**

1. Acknowledge the growing concerns about the infringement of civil liberties in Vietnam through the following measures:
  - a. Requesting the service of 20 peacekeepers and organizers from the UN to assist in the drafting of a resolution toward the amendment of the current Penal Laws, they will
    - i. Specifically, acknowledge Article 117 as a limit to the people's jurisdiction regarding freedom of speech.
    - ii. Ensure compliance with the protestors and also the government, acting as a negotiator and the voice of the protestors.
      1. The peacekeepers will negotiate a deal of rephrasing Article 117, changing it from criminalizing citizens for “Making, storing, spreading information, materials, items to oppose the State of Socialist Republic of Vietnam,” to Criminalizing “Making, storing, spreading information, materials, items to oppose the State of Socialist Republic of Vietnam; however if the information is objective, and directly correlates with the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, then that shall be legal”
2. Encourages the development and collaboration between the Vietnamese Government and the UN Peacekeepers,
  - a. Creation of a form to report crime accessible to all citizens
    - i. Encryption of this form to send data and queries only to UN databases
    - ii. Requires the application to be available in different regions and in multiple languages,
    - iii. Working with the aforementioned goals on improving internet access to all
  - b. Allow civilians to input information and open queries that allow the UN Peacekeepers to elicit information and open investigations on infringement of civil liberties.
  - c. With the strong collaboration, and the overall interest of amending the Penal Codes—specifically Article 117,
    - i. Citizens will feel comfortable, and that their civil liberties—speech—will be protected, and is nurtured by the government.
3. Endorse the request for \$500,000 USD from the UN funding, which will
  - a. Fund the mission of peace and negotiation through:
    - i. Supplies (paper, pens, posters, etc..)
    - ii. Meeting Spaces (safe houses)

- iii. Technology (computers)
    - iv. And Organized Government Meetings
    - v. Living expenses for the peacekeepers
  - b. Fund the amendment of the Justice system toward objective journalism.
- 4. With the authorization of the \$500,000 USD, the peacekeepers will reside in Vietnam for 2 years and,
  - a. Organize peaceful protests,
  - b. Host meetings with protestors,
  - c. Act as the people's representative in the governmental office, which can help
    - i. Control the tension,
    - ii. The government have a voice, and be able to communicate effectively with the protesters
    - iii. Actively engage the people and the government's effort to amend Article 117
- 5. Given 2 years to accomplish the peacekeeper's goals,
  - a. Change will occur between the relationship between government and people,
    - i. Which will only benefit both sides of the civil case
  - b. Change to the oppressive law, while uplift the people's trust in the government
- 6. Accepts the purpose of the group as essential to
  - a. Defending objective journalism—mentioned in clause “b” under article 2—as this is the root causation to the civil discourse, it's important because
    - i. Objective journalists provide the people with unbiased information, directly correlated from the government,
    - ii. Which will ease the tension among the conversation of the oppression of speech,
      - 1. Therefore solving the problem of civil uprising and discourse.
  - b. Giving the people, and the government a voice,
    - i. To speak
    - ii. To negotiate
    - iii. And to agree
- 7. Affirming the citizens the right to speech, by providing negotiators, and an agreement between government and objective journalism will only benefit Vietnam's conflicts among civility and government.

OC-04 Peacekeepers will additionally be tasked with monitoring the safety of Vietnamese workers. (Bangladesh)

OC-04 Funding will be increased to \$1.5 million. (Vietnam)

OC-08 Vietnam will pay back funding for this resolution over time. (Venezuela)
