3:40 Discussion on [newly passed changes to Title 5](#)

 - Social Sciences Chair Darlene Alioto, Counseling Chair Lisa Romano, and a number of counselors attended the meeting to participate in these important Title 5 discussions and how the Title 5 changes will impact learning and curriculum at CCSF. It was so wonderful to hear new voices at the meeting. Thank you. Please come again. Bring your friends.
 - Darlene shared concerns from Social Science faculty about not having a U.S. History and Government requirement, especially now, when it seems to be needed more than ever. Lots of conversation was built upon this very real and scary shared concern.
 - At issue is how things play out in the graduation requirement structure, as U.S. History and Government is not a GE area but a CSU graduation requirement and one that the CSU is "allowing" community colleges to satisfy, even though it is an "upper division" requirement there. That CSU "allowance" is a little unnerving, and it is compounded in oddity by their unwillingness to allow lifelong learning to be satisfied with lower division CCSF PE courses.
 - Based on the conversation, U.S. History and Government courses at CCSF might be heading in two directions:

- 1) It *will have to be* taken by all CCSF students wanting a CCSF associate degree, in other words, make it a distinct CCSF graduation requirement OR
 - 2) It *should be* chosen as a Social Sciences GE area course because it will also satisfy CSU's graduation requirement; in other words, promote social science double-dipping very clearly on documents guiding students' choices. This conversation needs to continue. Dip two different times or dip once to satisfy two needs. What's lost and what's gained in those dipping structures?
- There are also complications due to UC's treatment of world languages as graduation requirements, not GE areas. The fact several of CCSF's GE courses are already more than 3 units, and the new options that students will have to choose CalGETC pathways for graduation instead of local graduation pathways.
 - Rachel reminded everyone that the new legislation also clarifies that students already possessing a bachelor's degree will not have to retake gen ed courses.
 - These important conversations will continue. There are a number of issues at play related to ethics, equity, and social responsibility.
 - There are also design issues at play, as we need clear and meaningful ways to represent requirements and options to students, design strategies that will speak to multiple audiences.
