of practical Cultural outdoor
experiences to inspire and enrich
classroom teaching.

Learning experiences

Students begin the day with a Welcome to Country. They participate in yarns about Gomeroi Country and the significance of the Warrumbungles and surrounds. Students will explore and have first hand experience in the Aboriginal sites close to the EEC. Students investigate the local environment to create traditional arts and crafts. They find, collect and examine ochre, discussing its features and colours and adapt this to storytelling and mapping.
