This week, the carnage caused by climate-change fueled hurricanes and tornadoes is made more tragic by the disinformation campaign that is endangering meteorologists and FEMA employees.

The folks who are manipulating the weather are the ones who continue to promote dirty energy sources when the evidence that burning fossil fuels is the engine of climate change.

Stop abetting the fossil fuel industry and take action on behalf of your constituents. It's time to start congestion pricing, sign the Climate Change Superfund Act, and halt the Iroquois Pipeline expansion.

Congestion pricing is good health policy, good transit policy, and it shows that you care about all New Yorkers. We cannot accept that more than 70 percent of subway stations are inaccessible to people with disabilities.

The Climate Change Superfund Act would create legal liability for corporations that have caused dangers to health and safety by certain fossil fuel-related activity. If you sign the Climate Change Superfund Act, New York could collect \$75 billion over the next 25 years - roughly \$3 billion a year from oil and gas companies responsible for greenhouse gas emissions.

Elected officials and advocates have delivered thousands of comments asking you to stop the expansion of the Iroquois Pipeline instead of expanding it. I want to raise my voice once again to prevent this dangerous expansion.

The Iroquois Pipeline Company wants to drastically increase the amount of gas they push through their existing fracked gas pipeline, which runs from the New York/Canada

border to Long Island and NYC. In order to push more gas through the aging pipeline, they are applying to double the size of four already toxic, smog-producing, and noisy compressor stations that are currently running 24/7 in our communities. These would become much noisier and more toxic when nearly doubled in size by this proposal along the route of the pipeline.

Your decisions are crucial in protecting the right to every New Yorker to clean air, clean water, and a healthful environment. Thank you.
