Since the end of January, ICLT volunteers have been out talking to voters in House District 105.

We've held **8** canvasses, knocked **1663** doors (lit left) and had **447** conversations!

We not only know that face-to-face conversations with voters is the most effective way to get them to the polls, we also know the value of talking to voters early and often to have lasting impact. We'll be in HD105 through the election -but now is the critical time to reach voters with our deep canvassing script.

April 6th is the one-year anniversary of when a member of North Carolina's State House, Tricia Cotham, switched parties from Democrat to Republican and delivered the GOP a supermajority it didn't earn. Since betraying her voters, Tricia has provided the last vote Republicans needed to do everything from loosening restrictions on our gun laws to restricting abortion in our state.



Nicole Sidman is the Democratic nominee running to defeat Tricia Cotham this November. Her campaign is holding a canvassing event on **Saturday, April 6th from 10am-1pm** to help inform voters of the importance of this race.

North Carolina Democrats' state party chair and other statewide leaders will be joining us to help get the word out that you can't betray your voters and keep your job in the NC State House. If you're interested you can sign up here!

The questions and responses were powerful, insightful and thought-provoking as they grapple with a challenge that many candidates and organizations are also struggling to make headway on: engaging more young folks, particularly young Black men, in the electoral process in a meaningful and authentic way that moves us all towards progress. In the KNOW-Border and Immigration: Setting the Record Straight

THE BORDER AND IMMIGRATION: SETTING THE RECORD STRAIGHT

America has long been a key destination for those seeking a better life. Although immigration has sometimes led to political and economic strains on our nation, it has reaped tremendous long-term benefits for the US as we have become a multicultural, global political and economic powerhouse. The US is currently facing another period of increased immigration.

The Republican answer is to reject a
Bipartisan proposal that could address the
issue and continue to advocate for a
reprehensible "Border Wall" that they failed
to build during the Trump Administration.

- Many Americans believe that there is a crisis at the Southern Border and nearly 2/3 polled disapprove of the Biden Administration's handling of the Border as the number of unauthorized migrants increased from the Trump Administration peak of 852,000 in 2020 to 2 million in 2023. Some of this increase was due to pent-up immigration after the Pandemic.
- Most migrants are from Mexico and Central America, but some are from China as they seek refuge in the US for improved social, economic, political and climate conditions.
- Although most Americans still believe in the importance of immigration and their support of working class and lower skill positions. There are concerns about strains on social and government services as well as potential national security and crime issues.
- In fact, there's little evidence of crime committed by immigrants and immigrant communities have low crime rates.
- However, availability of fentanyl is a huge concern as manufacture in China and now Mexico of this easy to smuggle drug has led to an epidemic in the US.

Republican proposal

- H.R. 2 passed the House with no Democratic support; has not been considered by the Senate; and President Biden threatens to veto:
 - Bars migrants seeking asylum if they traveled through another country.
 - Gives Homeland Security Secretary power to prevent all undocumented entries.
 - Mandates 900-mile border wall.
 - Suspends Biden's humanitarian parole programs that have allowed thousands of migrants (like Afghan and Ukrainian refugees) to enter.
 - Requires children of detainees to be quickly returned to home country.
- Donald Trump has charged most migrants are mentally ill, gang members or murderers and has called them "animals" and "bad people". Trump plans to use the military to round-up undocumented immigrants and deport them.

Biden's Actions and Bipartisan Senate bill

- Reversed Trump Administration policies: boosted refugee admissions, acted against deporting undocumented immigrants who arrived as children, lifted pandemic restrictions that reduced visas, ended the "Remain in Mexico Policy" till the migrant's court date.
- Bipartisan proposal was quashed by Trump's intervention to preserve it as an issue for his campaign:
 - Funding for more border barriers, detention facilities expansion, Enforcement and Border Patrol agents, asylum officers and immigration judges.
 - Reduces asylum backlog and speeds up the process. Increases evidence needed to obtain asylum.
 - More funding to interdict fentanyl smuggling and human trafficking.
 - Failure to pass legislation will likely mean more Executive Orders, which are limited in scope and subject to court challenges.
