We are, at once, facing pressing questions about the rise of toxic populism, crassness in public discourse, existential environmental crises and assaults on the weak, marginalized and vulnerable. However, our societies seem incapable of responding to these challenges in robust and meaningful ways.

How did we get to this state of affairs? Can we turn things around? We believe that ethics can play a critical role in this regard. Because Individuals are the building blocks of communities and the broader society, we must begin with them. Individuals who live examined and ethical lives may be the key to rejuvenating the moral imagination and creating an ethical society.

Today, ethics seems to have been swept to the margins not only of philosophy, but also of politics, general social discourse and day-to-day life. As a result, we have lost something important to us as individuals, to our communities and the broader society. The absence of ethics allows selfishness, power, ego, vanity, materialism and tribalism to fill the vacuum.

Is this reading group just some kind of navel-gazing self-help project? Certainly not. While our starting point involves engaging with ethics as individuals, we will not stop there. When individuals begin to implement ethics in their daily lives they can influence the nature and content of public ethics, goods and values within society at large. In turn, this can mobilize action on social justice in order to build a just society.

Yes, it's all a bit dreamy, but we believe that individuals acting ethically are the roots of the tree that is the just society we aspire to grow. And, it all begins with one person, then another, and another.
