

# **ENGLISH 11H**

Grade Level: 11
\*\* English Regents Exam at the end of Grade 11

Full Year: 1 Credit

In eleventh grade English, the thematic emphasis is on the American experience, which serves as a literary parallel to what students study in their eleventh grade Social Studies classes: US History. Students will read diverse texts written by diverse voices - imaginative, poetic, and informational - in which characters are shaping themselves within the American experience. Similarly, students will write on a variety of topics that help them to reflect on their own identities and to consider the challenges that adolescents face when defining who they want to be in the world. Students enrolled in the H-Level course are expected to handle the rigor of the workload with greater independence and less teacher-scaffolding.

#### How is the course structured?

# **Course Components**

• Critical thinking and analysis, analytical writing, Schoology, Group work, narrative, analytical and argumentative writing assignments; independent reading.

Participation in Discussion, Individual and Small Group Activities, Daily Writing and Note-Taking,
 Projects, Research, Essay Writing in a Variety of Modes

# What can I expect?

#### Course Workload:

Active participation in class is necessary for success. Much of our work will be done in class except
for reading homework, and occasional assignments that require more time. Weekend homework is
rare to allow the students to balance their lives.

# **Homework Frequency:**

• Regularly, generally reading or written assignments.

• Reading, Writing, Online work, outside text or book questions and answers

• The Glass Castle Social Welfare Presentation on Child Abuse (for a "parenting class"); Socratic Seminar using "Civil Disobedience," for In the Time of the Butterflies
