- NBDC doesn't write the plan for you, but guides you through the process with a program, breaking it down one section at a time and helping identify edits. They use LivePlan, an online platform, FREE when you register through Alex. Check out the video at the top of the page Online Business Plan Software | LivePlan and the tour of the site: How It Works | LivePlan Tour which breaks down each step and what the screens look like. The platform uses Al to help structure sections. Once you have a login from NBDC, there isn't a deadline, you go at your own pace and your account will stay active as long as you are actively working on it. Once you are done with all the sections, NBDC puts it into a printable file format for you. (I am happy to review your business plan as well.)
 - They do not micromanage you, they are there to assist when you have questions and can offer suggestions. The advantage of going through NBDC is that they can do the marketing research and financial planning with/for you.

SourceLink Nebraska, based in Omaha but serving all of Nebraska's entrepreneurs, existing businesses, and resource partners. Their website is full of information - more resource partners, business guides, and training opportunities. By completing a 30 question Personal Action Plan, for FREE, they will create a personalized document for you with referrals to programs and resources. However, you can also access those same resources through a search function on the site! It's just that the action plan saves you time by having a team of two narrow down your resources.
