## FROM OUR HISTORY...

Action Line - Tues. June 14, 1997.

I'm with the St. Ann's Hill Historical Society, which is located about six blocks from the Oregon Village in East Dayton. We've tried with no luck to get information on how St. Ann's Hill got its name. We contacted both the Montgomery County Historical Society and the Public Library. Just wondered if you could help. — J.F., Dayton.

Martin Kelly, an amateur historian who works for the City of Dayton, has some early references concerning St. Ann's Hill, but no clue as to the name's origin. Kelly, former preservation officer for the historical society, lives in a house that's listed on the National Historical Register and discovered Oregon was an early name for the Burns-Jackson area. He found a reference to St. Ann's Hill in the 1880 *History of Dayton and Montgomery County*, which referred to the area as St. Ann's Hill under "Plats and Place Names." He uncovered another reference in an early 1840s newspaper in a classified ad for a greenhouse on St. Ann's Hill. The area, Kelly said, became known as Smith's Hill after T.D.S. Smith, who platted the area around Fifth & High Streets. In his research, Kelly also learned that during the Civil War it was called simply "the hill in the East End," and is one of several forming an arc around that section of the city.

Dayton City Commission has turned down a rezoning request by absentee landlord Hollis Tinch, who said he wanted to put in a grocery store at High and McLain streets. The grocery store idea met initial acceptance until some residents started to worry that a zoning change to B-1 could open the way for dirty book stores and such.

Meanwhile, parties on both sides of the issue got all hot and bothered, and vandalism, fire-bombing, thefts and hollering matches occurred. A certain civility seems to have been missing in this disagreement.

Perhaps next time Mr. Tinch will come up with a proposal to build a little Rollerball rink on that corner and any combatants who want to participate can get paid for their troubles.

## ***CARING FOR OUR HOMELESS NEIGHBORS: HOW TO HELP***

As the flowers begin to bloom in parks across the city, they can also sometimes be a place where we encounter neighbors experiencing homelessness.

If you see someone in need of assistance in our parks, the most effective way to help is to connect them with the professional outreach teams equipped to provide long-term stability.

Reach Out to Miami Valley Housing Opportunities (MVHO)

MVHO operates the Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH) team. These specialists go directly into our community to build relationships with unsheltered individuals and guide them toward healthcare and housing. They don't just provide a bed; they focus on sustainable, permanent housing solutions for those struggling with mental illness or disabilities.

- Non-Emergency Concerns: For safety concerns that are not immediate life-and-death emergencies, please call the Dayton Police non-emergency line at 937-333-COPS (2677) rather than 911.

By working with organizations like MVHO, we ensure that our neighbors in need receive more than just a temporary fix—they get a path toward a permanent home.

  - 2. Montgomery County Juvenile Court (MCJC) provides training; CASA volunteers investigate, facilitate, advocate, and monitor.
  - 3. MCJC asks for a 2-year commitment which demonstrates consistency to the children involved.

- B. Actual SAH funds = >\$45K.

- C. The city has agreed to make one of the tennis courts near Bomberger a pickleball court.
- D. Volunteer flyers with information about volunteer opportunities was created by board member Meredith Marks; they will be available at the brunch, added to new neighbor packets, added to the May newsletter, our Facebook page, the website and the bulletin board.
- E. Regarding adding the SAH calendar to your phone - Dot will re-send directions; the calendar includes meetings, Garden Club meetings/events, Book Club, Socials, Cleanups, and City events.
- F. Tree Lawns - some are in need of attention; if assistance mowing/trimming/edging is needed, contact Fred Bremer (937-580-0983).

### ***ABOUT ST. ANNE'S HILL HISTORIC DISTRICT***

St. Anne's Hill Historic District is located between the Oregon and Huffman historic districts, east of the central business district of Dayton, Ohio. While primarily residential in character, St. Anne's Hill Historic District has a vibrant business corridor along East Fifth Street. The majority of the buildings in the neighborhood were built in the 1800s and feature architectural styles such as Romanesque, Queen Anne, Second Empire, Folk Victorian, and American Foursquare. St. Anne's Hill was designated a historic district in 1974, gaining a place on the National Register of Historic Places in 1986.
