### **Part 1** (30 points)

### **Part 2** (60 points)

Choose **one** work from the following selection of novels. Novels available to read online are in bold. Other novels are available at libraries. I have copies of *Dracula*, *Wuthering Heights*, *The Jungle*, *The Handmaid's Tale*, and *The Namesake*. If you would like to borrow one of these texts, please let me know. I will be in the building several times in late June.

**For the novel you choose, complete the following activity.**

1. Before you read the novel, research its themes and historical context. Review themes to focus on as you read the story. Take **informal** notes on evidence that demonstrates the themes, and discuss how they demonstrate the themes. You will use the notes to study before you write an essay in class. Three pages of **handwritten** notes are needed.

I will be checking the notes for a completion grade, but I will not be collecting them.

- On the second day of class, there will be a writing assignment based on the novel. You will be given a writing prompt for which you will be asked to write a thesis statement and two developed paragraphs as support. You will need to read the text carefully to be able to answer the writing prompt as you will need multiple, specific details to use as support.
