## 2021 OCL Labor Day Tournament

All limited overs cricket rules apply with the following changes to it:

- 100 balls per innings
- Teams can name more than 11 but only 11 batters allowed and only 11 fielders on field at one time.
- A change of ends after 10 balls only
- Bowlers deliver 10 consecutive balls (cricclubs currently changes overs at 5 balls but same bowler can be selected to bowl the next cricclubs over as well)
- Each bowler can deliver a maximum of 20 balls per game (4.0 overs as per cricclubs display)
- A 30-ball power play start for each team
- Two fielders are allowed outside the initial 30-yard circle during the powerplay
- Maximum no. of balls per batsman 20. A batsman can be retired and brought back to bat as long as 20 balls have not been played by the batsman.
- To constitute a match, a minimum of 30 balls has to be bowled to the side batting second, unless a result has been achieved earlier.
- 2 points awarded for a win and 0 points for a loss.
- If there is a tie, a Super 5 will be used to end the tie. The rules of a Super 5 are as follows:
  - Each team decides a bowler to bowl and three batsmen to bat during one over of 5 balls named as the Super 5. The same ball used in the match will be used in super over.
  - The team batting second in the match will bat first in the Super 5.
  - Team A will score some runs in their 5 balls over and team B needs to chase it successfully to win the match. In case, it is unable to chase, team A wins.
  - In case two wickets fall, it is counted as all-out and the total made before losing the wicket is final.
  - In case scores are level for a super over, further Super 5s will be played till there
    is no tie.
