Our focus this month for Reading is sight words. Learning words by sight (memorizing) pays off. It allows kids to free up cognitive resources so they can focus on the tougher words that require strong decoding skills. They are also able to understand the majority of the text if those decoding skills fail.

To help your child at home you can:

- Print these sight words and review a few a day until they have mastered them.
- Point out sight words when you see them in magazines, books, stores, etc.
- Have your child guiz you on the words they already know (kids love being the teacher)

In-person learning

Online learners will not be able to return to in-person instruction until March 1st. Please contact the office with any questions.

Also, we have had many students to school in-person. Please be aware that we will continue many of our safety practices, but we may have more than three students at a round table due to spacing and at times students may share materials with their table mates. Additionally, we will have paras participating in WIN times in other classrooms. However, they will maintain contact for less than 15 minutes per station. We continue to wear masks in the classroom and keep kids in classroom cohorts to prevent any spread; however, please contact the office if your child may have medical conditions that need more attention.

Snow is here!

Snow is finally here! Please remember to send your student with cold weather gear. They will need snow pants and snow boots to be able to play off of the blacktop during recess.

Important Health Reminders

- If your child is sick, please keep him/her home.
- Please report any cases of COVID-19 in the household to a school official or the health department.
- If someone in the household is suspected of having COVID-19, all members of the household should stay home and the school should be informed.
- If anyone in the household is currently awaiting test results, have your child stay at home and contact the school.
- We will contact parents to come and pick their child up if they are not feeling well

Moving from Online to IN PERSON

Due to the complexity of moving students from online to in-person, we are asking that any parent that is delaying starting back their child after the school starts back on December 14th, return on one of our District Return Dates. The following dates have been established for this purpose:

Struggling to get your child to participate in online?

Here a few proven ideas and suggestions to help get your child to "buy in" to school.

- WORK in SMALL CHUNKS Make sure to keep things in little chunks with lots of physical breaks.
 - Childhood development experts generally say that a reasonable attention span to expect of a child is two to three minutes per year of their age. That's the period of time for which a typical child can maintain focus on a given task.
- **SCHEDULE** Have a set schedule for lessons. Routine and consistency is one of the most important keys to success with little ones.
- REWARDS Reward cards or reward systems work great!!! Contact your child's teacher if you need
 ideas.
 - EXAMPLE: Your child earns stickers for working through each assignment before dinner. Then, stickers can be exchanged for TV time or game time. If you get your child's input it will be most effective and it MUST be consistent.
- **Be POSITIVE!** This is a stressful time, but students will always take a cue from their caretakers. If you are upset or stressed, they won't work as well.
 - Ideas for relaxation: To calm things you and your child can listen to relaxation music, participate in <u>Cosmic Kid Yoga</u>, or participate in Mrs. Wiggin's Google Classroom ideas (Classroom code 2tnmogm)
- **BE ACTIVE** Kindergarten students are ACTIVE! Don't feel that they have to sit at the kitchen table to work through lessons. Put on the lesson and they can be singing, jumping or dancing while watching. This will also get them exercise to burn off energy. Do it together and their engagement will go through the roof (and it is a nice workout for you too!)
 - o Join Mr. Noble's class at 9:30 or 12:30 to get out the wiggles Google Meet with Mr. Noble
- **EXERCISE** Have your child regularly go outside (even when it is cold) to run and play. Having them participate
- OFFICE HOURS Have your child stop in the teachers Office Hours and they will encourage them to participate in the process!

Masks reminders

Just a reminder that students are required to wear masks everyday at school. Shield can only be worn in place of a mask with a doctor's note. Also, please make sure to regularly wash mask to keep our little ones healthy. Please contact the office or your child's teachers with any questions.

Masks

Students have done a great job of being safe and wearing their masks while in school. We have had to issue a couple of reminders of making sure the masks cover the students nose. Please help us by reminding your child at home of the proper way of wearing a mask. Also, a friendly reminder to make sure to wash or replace your child's mask daily. This will keep your child and others safe.



COVID-19 Screening

As a reminder, families need to screen their student daily before school and not send their student to school if they display any of the symptoms of COVID-19 identified by the CDC, in an Executive Order, or in a local health department order. Symptoms include:

- Fever of 100.4 degrees or higher
- New or worsening cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing NEW or DIFFERENT or WORSE from your baseline of any chronic illness
- Chills NEW or DIFFERENT or WORSE from your baseline of any chronic illness
- Headache NEW or DIFFERENT or WORSE from your baseline of any chronic illness
- Sore throat NEW or DIFFERENT or WORSE from your baseline of any chronic illness
- Loss of smell or taste NEW or DIFFERENT or WORSE from your baseline of any chronic illness
- Muscle pain NEW or DIFFERENT or WORSE from your baseline of any chronic illness
- Had close contact with an individual diagnosed with COVID-19

Corunna Food Service Free Meals Information

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has announced schools will be able to serve free meals to all children through December 31, 2020, or until the federal funding runs out.

This means ALL Corunna students are now going to receive a FREE breakfast and lunch!

This waiver allows us to go back and reimburse all students that were charged a breakfast and/or lunch since the beginning of this school year (8/24 - 8/31/2020). This may take some time, so please be patient. If your child was charged for a meal during the first 6 days of school, you will see a credit for this.

Online Students

Online Learning Update

Students that have picked the option of online learning will be interacting with their teacher, special education teacher, or specials teacher. Assignments will be made available in weekly chunks and can be completed when convenient during the day. Students must have a caregiver to assist with learning which might mean assignments need to be completed in the evenings or on weekends when a caregiver is available. Instruction by teachers will occur through videos which can be viewed as many times as you or your child needs and/or would like. Teachers will be available to answer questions via email or phone. Parents must understand that communication may be delayed because these same teachers will be teaching to our in person students during school hours. Teachers have been encouraged to respond to all email and phone messages within a 24 hour time period. Parents should plan on coming to the school (roughly once a week) to pick up some learning materials that might be necessary to complete online learning (examples: classroom novel, textbook, math manipulatives, handouts, etc.)

Teachers are required to have two-way communication with students each week to discuss academic progress. Assignments may be graded and participation through returned work or weekly communication will be monitored for attendance purposes.

If you were a parent who indicated you didn't have a reliable internet connection, our plan is to load materials onto a flash drive to allow your student to access learning materials without the internet. This would need to be picked up on a weekly basis. We also have wi-fi connection available in all of our district parking lots. Please contact your teacher with any questions.

Online students ONLY - Meals

We are committed to offering healthy meals to your students during their online learning. We will be offering meals to all virtual learners for pick up once a week. These meals are charged the same as if your student would be attending school. If your student attends Louise Peacock, Nellie Reed, or Elsa Meyer they will receive free breakfast and lunch. If your student attends the Middle School or High School, your student will be charged based upon your meal application status of free, reduced (breakfast \$0.30/Lunch \$0.40) or paid (breakfast \$1.50/lunch \$2.75).

Google Classroom - ONLINE LEARNERS

We are not going to start the year using Google Classroom. I want all parents to get comfortable with the format of online learning first. We will slowly introduce families to Google classrooms in the future. Right now everything will be sent by email and anything you are turning in should be emailed to the teacher.

Pesticide Prior Notification

Parents and guardians are entitled to receive notice by mail at least 3 days prior to any application of pesticides. If a Request for Advanced Notification by First Class Mail is preferred, a form must be requested and filled out at the superintendent's office at 124 N. Shiawassee Street, Corunna, MI 48817.

Learning Plans - ONLINE and In Person

Each week in our update we will include the Learning Plan for the Week. You will see the link above the calendar items. This is intended primarily for online parents instruction, but it is also a great way to reinforce learning at home for in-person students. If your child is coming to school each day, you can rewatch videos, do activities, etc. Both in person and online students are working on the same concepts.

School Time

The school day will begin at **9:40 a.m.** and ends at **4:00 p.m.** The doors to Nellie Reed will open at 9:30 am each morning.

Teacher hours

Please be aware that our teacher hours are from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day. You can expect that if you call or email that a teacher will respond within 24 hours during the school week and during teacher hours.

Parent Visits

In the past we have always welcomed our parents into the building and encouraged involvement. This year we will be limiting access to individuals that are not students or Nellie Reed staff as a safety measure.

<u>Temperature checks</u>

Parents will be responsible for checking their child's temperature each day before sending their child to school. In circumstances where we feel like a child might not be feeling well, we will use a touchless thermometer to check their temperature on an as needed basis.

Masks

Children, staff, and parents will be required to wear masks at Nellie Reed. It is highly recommended that your child has five masks (one for each day). If that is not possible, masks should be washed on a daily basis. Masks should be worn once a student enters the building and will remain on except for meals or when students take breaks outside. We understand that students may struggle in the

beginning wearing masks all day. We will work diligently with students at the beginning of the year to assure they understand the expectation and the importance while still maintaining a fun environment. Please get a style of mask that your child feels comfortable wearing for a long duration.

Lunch/Recess

Students will have 45 minutes in their day dedicated to lunch/recess. During that time they will be with a small cohort of students that will be primarily made up of their classmates. They will be socially distanced at lunch and we will encourage them to socially distance at recess. Students will not have to wear masks at lunch or during outdoor recess.

Lockers

Students at Nellie Reed will be allowed to use their lockers during supervised times. They will be taken out to their lockers in small groups while they are socially distanced.

Water Bottles

Students are encouraged to bring a water bottle to school that is labeled with their name. Students will not be able to use the levers on water fountains. We are in the process of having a touchless water bottle filler installed. Until then, staff will help students refill water bottles when needed.

Pandemic **EBT**

Important information for parents or guardians of student's eligible for Free and Reduced Lunch at Nellie Reed Elementary.

What is the Pandemic-EBT Program?

The Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) Program gives food benefits to families with children who were not able to get free or reduced-price school meals due to COVID. You may hear about this benefit from other schools or in the media.

Who is eligible?

Being eligible for this program will depend on what school your student attends. Eligibility for the Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) Program can be different between schools within the same district.

What makes a school eligible for P-EBT?

A school building is eligible only if the building has had 5 school days in a row of reduced in-person hours due to COVID.

What could make my student eligible for P-EBT?

- 1) If the school they attend is eligible for P-EBT and
- 2) If your student normally gets free and reduced meals at school and
- 3) If your student is not getting instruction in-person for some or all the month.

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) issues P-EBT benefits based on:

- How each school building reports their eligibility
- How most of the students attend school during the month

There may be months when your student's attendance was different from what the school reported. In that case, you may be able to have your student's benefit level reconsidered. Your request to be reconsidered must be submitted by June 30, 2021. In the month(s) below your school reported primarily in-person. Your student(s) may be P-EBT eligible if they attended class on-line, for some time or all the time in the following month(s):
