Grade Level News

Kindergarten

Language Arts:

Students will be focusing on beginning sounds, phonics, and fluency with the letters "S" "s". They will listen to the read aloud book, "Little Red Hen". High frequency words will be "I", "like", "the", "and".

Math:

Students will be subtracting and adding problems within 5. They will be representing subtraction with objects, fingers, mental images, drawings and addition with objects and fingers.

There were a lot of students that earned their white belt in sight word karate this past week! Keep it up!

First Grade

Language Arts:

Each class is reading the story, "Jack and the Wolf". There are no spelling and reading tests this week. Students will learn consonant digraphs. These digraphs are "wh", "ch", "sh", "ck".

Math:

Students are working on subtraction strategies.

Second Grade

Language Arts:

Each class is doing an author study and comparing and contrasting texts. There are no reading or spelling tests this week.

Math:

Students will be in module 2 and focusing on equal groups.

Third Grade

Language Arts:

Students will be reading pages pgs. 122-149 "Pop's Bridge". Their vocabulary words are foggy, stretch, crew, balancing, tide, cling, excitement, disappears.

Math:

Students will be taking their module 2 test over relating multiplication and area. Miss Row's will take this test on Thursday, while the rest will take it on Wednesday. Classes will then begin working on module 3, which covers multiplication strategies.

Fourth Grade

Language Arts:

Miss Cottrill's students will be working on the author's purpose and will continue to read "Tales of a 4th Grade Nothing".

Mrs. Shipley's students will continue to work on paragraph writing and inferences. They will also continue to review other skills they have worked on in previous weeks.

1st 9 Weeks:

Book Report is due October 19th.

Social Studies:

Mrs. Shipley's class will read and discuss Studies Weekly Week 6: The Northwest Ordinance.

Mrs. Cottrill's class is studying the American Revolution.

Math:

Students are learning to multiply a whole number of 4 digits by a one digit whole number. Students can assess math on the spot videos on the Ed platform for homework assistance.

If students are absent, assigned work can be found in Google Classroom and on Ed. These can be accessed through their Clever account.

Science:

Students will be reading Life Science Weekly 6. They will be continuing their study of animals.

Programs in the Building

What is B.L.U.E?

B.L.U.E. stands for Behavior Leading Us to Excellence.

Every nine weeks, students have a chance to earn blue bucks from their classroom teacher. They earn these with good acts of behavior.

At the end of every nine weeks, if a student meets the required amount of blue bucks they will earn a nine weeks reward.

B.L.U.E. is our PBIS program, which stands for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports.

Below are the three tiers of behavior interventions of PBIS. Students that do not meet our nine weeks reward will receive a tier 2 small group intervention. Tier 3 is used for individual students.

Tier 1: Universal Prevention (All)

Tier 1 supports serve as the foundation for behavior and academics. Schools provide these universal supports to all students. For most students, the core program gives them what they need to be successful and to prevent future problems.

Tier 2: Targeted Prevention

This level of support focuses on improving specific skill deficits students have. Schools often provide Tier 2 supports to groups of students with similar targeted needs.

Tier 3: Intensive, Individualized Prevention

Tier 3 supports are the most intensive supports the school offers. These supports are the most resource intensive due to the individualized approach of developing and carrying out interventions.

PAX Good Behavior Game

Each teacher has been trained to implement this program in their classrooms. PAX is used to increase self-regulation, group regulation, and increase positive behavior amongst students and reduce negative behavior.
