## How you can contribute based on your time

- **If you have 1 hour or less**, set up your Wikipedia user page and make some simple edits to existing pages.
- **If you have 90 minutes**, add some links and citations to an article in your area of interest.
- **If you have 2 hours**, add a well cited paragraph to an article in your area of interest.
- **If you have 2-4 hours**, consider creating a new article or translating an article. Be sure to gather your *reliable sources* and check in with an experienced Wikipedian to ensure that your article meets Wikipedia's *notability guidelines*. Once you select something, tell a facilitator, and we'll get it added to the Dashboard (or assign it to yourself).
- **If you don't want to edit but want to contribute**, help us identify articles to improve. Talk to one of the library volunteers about options.

Wide-ranging in scope, this new encyclopedia complements courses in a variety of disciplines, including history, American studies, literature, psychology, sociology and others.
