
THE CALDECOTT CHALLENGE

for **2nd grade Students** at Daly

Dear Parent(s),



Where to get the books? Your child can choose a Caldecott book from the school library each week (or even daily! (One book at a time). Please, be sure to also take your child to the Port VVashington Public Library to borrow Caldecott books. The librarians in the children's room are supportive of this project and usually put the books on display for us. Additionally, you may have some of these award-winning books at home!

As your child reads more books on the list, he/she has the opportunity to win small incentives as outlined below. On the next page, you will find parent sign-off slips. As goals are met, please sign, cut off the strips, and have your child return them to the library! As an added incentive, all children who hand in 5 slips by May 31, 2025, will become part of the "Caldecott Club!" All club members will be invited to the library to receive a certificate, take part in a fun Caldecott trivia game, and get their (group) picture taken with the principal.

Read any 10 books on the list = receive a bracelet & 1st charm

Read 20 books = receive 2nd charm

Read 30 books = receive 3rd charm

Read 40 books = receive 4th charm

Read 50 books = receive 5th charm (Reading 50 books qualifies for <u>The Caldecott Club!</u>)

Read 60 books = receive 6th charm

Read 70 books or more = receive 7th charm + bonus trophy charm

Again, each child can participate on a level that is appropriate and comfortable for him/her. It is certainly NOT a race to finish quickly. Instead, the goal is for children to take their time and appreciate the stories and beautiful illustrations!

Books can be read in any order! Please note that the title for 2008, The Invention of Hugo Cabret, is a very long (illustrated) chapter book. Although some students will welcome the challenge, it is intended for an older audience so you may want to skip this one (as well as some of the real oldies)...

Thank you for encouraging your child to participate in this worthwhile program and for helping to foster a love of reading!
