








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## Solidarity Event May 5th at the Ship Bar and Grill



Are you aware that NYSUT offers Professional Development and Graduate Level Courses for **CTLE Requirement** and **Salary Advancement**? NYSUT ELT stands for **E**ducation and **L**earning **T**rust. ELT offers courses that are applicable to **ALL TEACHERS AND STAFF**. The courses that are offered range from Advanced Professionalism (helps if you are a new Department Chair) to Mindfulness in the Classroom to Special Education for the Classroom Teacher and **MORE!** Since NYSUT ELT is a **Member Benefit**, you can take these seminars and graduate level courses at a discounted rate. With graduate level courses, **you can earn your 3 college credits in as little as a week** (Take a look at February break!)- These courses can also help lead to certification in ENL and SPED. NYSUT ELT courses are taught by NYSUT Members from all over the state. You can take site based courses which are offered locally or take them online/remotely. We currently have two LEA members (1 retired and 1 current) that offer classes through NYSUT ELT. Many of our LEA Brothers and Sisters have taken courses through NYSUT ELT for Certification and Salary Advancement. Members who have taken these courses always comment on how easy it is to implement the strategies and ideas into their teaching practice the very next day! 

### School Board Races:

We have a number of candidates who have gathered petitions with intent to run for school board. We have 3 open spots. LEA Endorsed Candidates for BOE:

**Joseph J. Runfola II.**


Also, be sure to **vote YES** (secret phrase) on the school budget!

### Committee of 100 Requests:

- 1) Fix Tier 6: NYSUT urges the legislature to include provisions to flatten the employee pension contribution to 3 percent for all members in Tier 6 as part of the 2023-24 state budget.
- 2) Foundation Aid : NYSUT urges the legislature to support the executive budget proposal to provide \$2.7 billion in Foundation Aid and fully fund the expense-based aids, support SED's request for \$1 million to undertake a process to update the Foundation Aid formula. Also, to reject the set-aside funding for high-impact tutoring.
- 3) APPR: NYSUT urges the legislature to pass legislation to pause the APPR process for the current school year and restore local control by allowing school districts to either keep the APPR system that is currently in place or allow them to collectively bargain a new system that will allow them to provide accountability, make tenure decisions and provide feedback to educators.
- 4) Teacher Center: NYSUT urges the legislature to restore funding for Teacher Centers at \$21.4 million to help provide the necessary collaboration and professional learning for educators that students deserve.
- 5) Higher Education (SUNY & CUNY): NYSUT urges the legislature to provide SUNY with an additional \$350.5 million. Provide CUNY with an additional \$333.5 million. Provide SUNY community colleges with \$493.5 million in base aid. Provide CUNY community colleges with \$228.87 million in base aid.
- 6) Charter Schools: NYSUT urges the legislature to reject the executive budget proposals that would combine the two regional caps into a single statewide cap. Enact legislation to ensure that school districts have a voice in local educational, fiscal and program matters by authorizing them to approve an initial charter school application and any subsequent renewal, modification, supplementation or revision to a charter's application. Also, to grant the Board of Regents the ability of final approval authority over all proposed/renewed charter schools. Lastly, a charter school's ability to expand grade levels beyond its current grade configurations.
- 7) BOCES Programs: NYSUT urges the legislature to support the executive budget proposal to establish a new \$10 million High School College Workforce Transformation Grants program.
- 8) Special Schools: NYSUT urges the legislature to restore the \$2 million cut to 4201 Schools and ensure that they receive funding-increase parity with other special education providers.



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### **VOTE/COPE is Needed More Than Ever, Here are the Priorities:**

The 2023/24 VOTE/Cope campaign will start in May. VOTE/Cope is instrumental in leading our fight. We had 84% of our members contribute in 2022/23, let's strive to improve that percentage. The ask is \$6.25 per pay for a total of \$100. If every member increases by just \$0.25, our contribution will increase by over \$2000. We must work together as we battle these important issues. Also, 40% of our contributions are returned to the LEA for our own training, team building and school board races. VOTE/Cope contributions put us at the table instead of on the menu!
