

Bayliss Fiddiman is the Director of Educational Equity and Senior Counsel at the National Women's Law Center. In her role she advocates for policies that keep girls of color from being pushed out of school and for the rights of pregnant and parenting students. She previously worked as Associate Director on the K-12 Education team at the Center for American Progress where she advocated for state and federal policies that increase access to a high-quality education for all children. Prior to that she worked at the Education Law Center in Newark, NJ where she advocated to protect and increase funding for public education, and for the rights of students under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. She also worked at the Educational Testing Service where her research focused on addressing gaps in access to a quality education.

She received her B.A. in legal studies from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst with Commonwealth Honors College distinction, and her J.D. from Northeastern University School of Law. After law school she worked as Legal Fellow for the Civil Rights and Restorative Justice Project which investigates cold cases of anti-civil rights violence and seeks restorative justice on behalf of families and communities. Outside of work, she serves as President of the Greater Washington Area Chapter, Women Lawyers Division, National Bar Association (GWAC), and as Co-chair of the Women in Public Service and Politics Committee for the Women's Bar Association of DC.
