Dear «Contact»,

As educators we realize the importance of sharing information with the parents of our students. In taking the next step of this ongoing process, the teachers are ready to open their grade books to you via web access. This letter will hopefully explain the procedure.

The following «AccountType» registration key is intended for «Contact». In order to create your new account you must have an email address. If you don't have an email there are many free options online such as Gmail. To get a free Gmail account visit **accounts.google.com** and click "Sign Up".

If you have an email address your first stop is the Parent Access home page: ***<https://pa.noeca.org>***

Click on our district link / logo (Huron). Then click the blue "Sign up" button. Select the "I am a Parent" button on the next screen. You'll be taken through the next 3 steps that will ask you to enter your Parent information, a user name / password, and lastly it will ask you for the following student information:

*The first and last names entered must match, EXACTLY, what is listed on this document.
Also enter your student's birth date in the mm/dd/yyyy format.*

You can also enter other registration keys for your other children by clicking "Enter another registration key". After pressing "Register", Click "Log in to your new account". From there, you will still be able attach more children to your single logon, navigate around your child's information, and create accounts for your student/s (if the schools has not already done so). Please be patient with us as this is a learning process for us too. If you have any questions please let us know. We depend on your input to make this a better service for future users.

Everything contained within this site is encrypted as it travels across the internet to prevent 'hackers' from having access to your child's information. Never share your username and password with others. This goes for your children as well. They should have their own student account. Only let them know their own STUDENT user name and password and not your own. Your parent account will be able to reset your child's password if they were to forget.
