

The focus of this activity is to make good sentences in the Present Simple to discuss scheduled events in the future.

You are given information about future events. For each of these events, you are missing information. Your partner has this information in his or her document.

All of the information is about scheduled events in the future. For this, we usually use the Present Simple in English.

Example:

Tomorrow

- **Work / Start:** 8:30 AM ~ **Work / End:**

We are missing the end time of work tomorrow. As such, we ask our partner (in the Present Simple)...

What time does work end tomorrow?

Your partner should check the information and answer (in the Present Simple)...

Work ends at 3 PM tomorrow.

You then add this information to your document.

Your partner will then ask you a question.

a. Tomorrow

- **Auto Repair class / Start:** ~ **Auto Repair class / End:** 3 PM

b. Monday Evening

- **Motorcycle Racing Practice / Begin:** 7 PM ~ **Motorcycle Racing Practice / Finish:**

c. Next Week

- **Flight to Seattle / Leave:** ~ **Flight to Seattle / Arrive:** 2:25 PM

d. Tomorrow

- **Meeting / Start:** 9 AM ~ **Meeting / Finish:**

e. Tuesday Night

- **Repair Engine / Begin:** ~ **Repair Engine / End:** 8 PM

f. Tomorrow

- **Parts Store / Open:** ~ **Parts Store / Close:** 7 PM

g. Tomorrow

- **Mario's Dealership / Open:** ~ **Mario's Dealership / Close:** 5 PM

h. This Evening

- **Movie / Start:** ~ **Movie / Finish:** 9:30 PM

i. Sunday:

- **First train / Leave:** ~ **Last train / Leave:** 10:20 PM

j. June

- **Auto Sale / Start:** June 15th ~ **Auto Sale / End:**
