Support for Ukrainian music industry

- Ukrainian institute together with European Jazz Network published a <u>list of Ukrainian</u>
 <u>musicians</u> who now live in EU countries and evacuated from Ukraine since the beginning of
 war. You are welcome to share this list among your partners festivals, venues, media
 representatives etc. And thus invite Ukrainian musicians to join festival programs, concert
 vanues and other initiatives.
- 2. Participance at conferences, panel discussions: Olga Bekenshtein (music curator, Am I Jazz? Festival director, Kyiv) presents a lecture/ listening session on how music defines politics and the role of the music industry in it. In the examples of Ukrainian music between the 1930s and nowadays, we will talk about cultural appropriation, marginalization, and national resistance. How the music industry helps us reconsider notions of identity and nation, and how its representation has the power to undermine dominant social norms and change political narrative.

Timing: ~1h 60% speech/ 40% audio-video materials

3. Since the war in Ukraine began, many Ukrainian professional musicians were mobilized, others are actively engaged in charity concerts to support Ukrainian army, refugees and help people to survive. They play in the **subways in Kharkiv** to support families with their kids and pets who have been living there already for 2 months
