Virus Alert

The Directors of the Midwest Dahlia Conference have agreed to take up the cause to promote the destruction of tubers from plants with viruses. Not all dahlias have viruses, but we need to get rid of those that do. In accordance with this strategy, **entries in MDS show that exhibit leaves showing signs and symptoms of virus will be penalized** per the judges' manual and a notation made recommending destruction of the stock. 

Table 1 is for Sized Dahlias. The left column lists each Size with its corresponding 1st digit. The right column lists each Form with its corresponding 2nd digit.

Table 2 is for Other Forms. Each Form has its own corresponding first 2 digits.

Table 3 is for Color. This table is used in conjunction with either Table 1 or Table 2.

Example 1: a B-IC-FL would be a 2412. B size, 1st digit is 2; IC, 2nd digit is 4 (1st & 2nd digits come from Table 1); FL, Flame, is 12 (from Table 3).

Example 2: a WL-DP would be a 7305. WL is a 73 (from Table 2); DP, Dark Pink, is 05 (from Table 3).

Example 3: working backwards, a 4010 would be M-FD-LB. 1st digit, 4, is M; 2nd digit, 0, is FD (1st & 2nd digits come from Table 1); last two digits, 10, is LB, Light Blend (from Table 3).

Example 4: working backwards, a 9015 would be a CO-BI. First 2 digits 90, is CO (from Table 2); last two digits, 15 is BI, Bicolor (from Table 3).



Entry Tag Information

1. The Section for the Entry, for example: N for Novice, SG for Small Grower, OTA for Open to All, etc.
2. ADS Classification Number (see Key to 4-Digit Class Numbers)
3. Name of Flower, for example: Embrace, Zorro, etc. If there is room, it is also helpful to add the entry section (e.g. AA, BB, NX, WL, etc.).
4. Your MDS Exhibitor Number and your name (optional). Exhibitor Numbers are listed in the Membership Directory. If you do not have or do not remember your exhibitor number, contact Andrew Compton (atcompton@gmail.com).

Fold on the perforation and insert into the cut-out flap to cover your Exhibitor Number, Name, and Address. **Do Not Staple.**

General Show Rules

See Sections Artistic Arrangements (AR) for additional rules that apply to those sections.

1. All exhibitors must be members in good standing with the Minnesota Dahlia Society or an American Dahlia Society affiliated society.

Venue: Bachman's Garden Center, 6010 Lyndale Ave. S, Minneapolis.

2. Staging Times: Exhibits may be staged on Friday, September 12 from Noon to 6:30pm. Saturday, September 13 from 7-8:30am. Entry is not allowed to the show site between the hours of 7pm-7am. You should park in the back employee lot and enter through the back employee door. Access Code has been emailed to members.

3. **Exhibits must be in place by 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, September 13th, the day of judging.** No entry may be placed until the show chairperson or their designee opens the exhibit rooms for placement. Entry tags must be attached when exhibits are placed.

4. **Section - Open to All (OTA):** For an undisseminated seedling to be eligible, the variety must be 3 or more years old. Each entry must be named with the proper numerical identification as outlined in *Classification of Dahlias*.

5. The exhibitor must grow the bloom(s) being shown, except in sections AR.

6. If an exhibitor grows dahlias for the purpose of selling tubers, rooted cuttings, plants, or cut flowers, they must exhibit in the '**Open to All**' sections.

7. If an exhibitor uses a cloth house, they must exhibit in the '**Open to All**' sections. A cloth house is a framework with attached or suspended material that covers the top and/or all sides to shade plants and protect from bugs.

8. Exhibitors may use umbrellas, bag individual blooms, or use cloth draped over plants without any structural framework. This is allowed in all sections.
9. The use of any artificial material, such as wire, splints or cords, to support the stem above the container will disqualify the entry. **Staging material may not extend more than ½ inch above the rim of the container.**
10. Each variety must be exhibited in a class consistent with its ADS classification regardless of the actual size of the bloom. No bloom so entered will be disqualified by the judges because of its size.
11. Any **undisseminated seedling variety** not listed in the ADS Classification Handbook must be taken to the classification table for assignment of a classification number, unless previously classified at an ADS accredited show. Exhibitors must move their own entries from the classification table to the show tables by 8:30 a.m. Saturday morning. All items must have an entry tag with a variety name or seedling identifier. Once a seedling receives a classification, it is to retain that classification number for future shows until submitted to be reclassified. **Please do not use the classification table as a means of identifying a dahlia unknown to the exhibitor.**
12. The show committee provides containers for one and three bloom entries. Multiple bloom entries may use provided containers, if available, or containers brought by the exhibitor.
13. Buds showing color will be counted as blooms .
14. Awards will not be made unless an exhibit is considered sufficiently meritorious. If judges cannot award a first-place ribbon, a second or third may be given.
- 15 Any bloom entered in the wrong class or with an incorrect variety name may be moved to its proper class or disqualified if that class has already been judged.

16. Any entry without an attached pair of leaves will be disqualified. A set of leaves growing up to an inch apart is considered “paired”. No more than 2 sets of leaves, as needed for proportion, are recommended. Exception: Containers (Section CNT).

17. No entries or ribbons may be withdrawn from the show or removed from the showroom without permission of the show chairperson.

18. The society is not responsible for loss or damage to exhibits or personal property of exhibitors. Exhibitors are solely responsible for retrieving their vases, baskets, and other personal material immediately after the closing of the show.

19. Family member couples who share the work of their dahlias may exhibit under either member’s name or may choose to divide their entries. However, points earned will be combined when determining eligibility for the Novice (N) section. Either member may receive credit for meeting the growing and showing requirement of Judge Accreditation.

20. Children sponsored by Minnesota Dahlia Society Members may exhibit in the Novice section until they reach their 18th birthday. They may also exhibit in the ‘Open to All’ sections. Blooms exhibited must be from plants for which the ‘Junior’ member provided most of the care from planting to show.

21. Any entry receiving a 1st place ribbon in ADS classification range 0001-1515 is eligible for the Largest Bloom Award. Largest Bloom is based 100% on size.

22. The show chairperson may disqualify and/or remove any entry deemed to be diseased or infested.

Awards:

Special Award Ribbon and a Dahlia Society Medal for the best 1st place entry in each division.

Court of honor ribbon will be awarded to the most outstanding exhibit in the section.

Artistic Arrangement Rules

1. Definition of Divisions:

- A 'Junior' is a family member or member sponsored child under 18 years of age.
- A 'Novice' is a person who has never won a blue ribbon in arranging in any major show.
- An 'Amateur' is a person who has won at least one but less than five blue ribbons in arranging in any major show.
- An 'Advanced Amateur' is a person who has won five or more blue ribbons in arranging in major shows.
- A major show is a standard show held by State Societies, State Fairs, Special Societies, and Federated Garden Clubs.

2. An exhibitor who has won five (5) Court of Honor arrangements may only enter in the Open to All Classes.

3. An exhibitor may only submit one (1) entry for each class. In addition to entering the classes for which they qualify, exhibitors may enter any more advanced class.

4. Flowers need not be grown by the exhibitor, but the predominant floral material must be Dahlias.

5. No state conservation plant material is to be included in any floral design.

6. Entries must contain fresh or dried natural plant material (no artificial). Only dried material may be treated (e.g., painted, etc.). Driftwood is permissible. Mats, bases, accessories, accessory containers, and backgrounds are permitted. Uncut fruit, vegetables or seeds may be used in floral designs unless indicated otherwise.

7. Arrangements are not to exceed 20 inches in width or depth, but are not limited as to height.

8. All exhibits must be in place by Saturday 8:30 a.m. Exhibitors may not remove exhibits before the end of the show, Sunday after 3:00 pm. If they cannot be there, they need to make arrangements with someone to remove and return their materials
9. Do not use flags or lights.
10. Work tables are provided. Exhibit tables may not be used for setup.
11. If time permits, judges are requested to leave brief comments with entries to help improve future workmanship.
12. Judging is based on the National Council of Garden Club's Rule Book.

Section DY - Dahlia of the Year

Single-bloom entries of **Alpen Bill** Classification #2210 (semi-cactus) will be accepted for the 2025 Dahlia of the Year section.

Section CNT – Containers

This section is for multiple dahlia blooms in a container. An exhibit must contain blooms of a single named variety. Minimum numbers of blooms are listed for each class. Blooms must be shown disbudded with dahlia foliage in proportion to the exhibit. No additional materials are allowed in this class.

CNT1 – Vase or Basket of 5 or more AA size blooms of any one variety

CNT2 – Vase or Basket of 5 or more A size blooms of any one variety

CNT3 – Vase or Basket of 5 or more B size blooms of any one variety

CNT4 – Vase or Basket of 7 or more BB size blooms of any one variety

CNT5 – Vase or Basket of 7 or more Ball size blooms of any one variety

CNT6 – Vase or Basket of 7 or more Waterlilies of any one variety

CNT7 – Vase or Basket of 7 or more Stellars or Novelty Double blooms of any one variety

CNT8 – Bowl, Vase or Basket of 10 or more Miniatures or Miniature Balls of any one variety

CNT9 – Bowl, Vase or Basket of 10 or more Micros or Pompons of any one variety

CNT10 – Bowl, Vase or Basket of 10 or more Open Center blooms (Peony, Anemone, Novelty Open, Collarette, Orchid, Orchette, Single) of any one variety

CNT11 – Bowl, Vase or Basket of 10 or more Micro Open Center blooms (Micro Peony, Micro Anemone, Micro Novelty Open, Micro Collarette, Micro Orchid, Micro Orchette, Mignon Single) of any one variety

Section N – Novice

Open to all members within their initial five (5) years of exhibiting blooms or until they accumulate 200 points in ADS Affiliated Society Dahlia shows. Reminder: exhibitors must adhere to Show Rules 7 and 8. A person entering blooms in this section may also exhibit in the “Open to All” sections.

SINGLE BLOOM ENTRIES with ADS classification numbers 0001-5515

Section SG – Small Growers

Open to all members who grow no more than 75 plants for exhibition, excluding seedlings. Reminder: exhibitors must adhere to Show Rules 7 and 8. A person entering blooms in this section may also exhibit in the “Open to All” sections.
