Minutes

Welcome, Apologies & Exec Member of the Month

Improving Membership Experience

- CL Alderdice review is about how to interact with members etc. Notes we haven't checked how much progress we've made from previous to the report. This is an opportunity to ask members about their experience both positive and negative - and come up with how we can change to provide better experiences. CL is looking for advice/feedback on the actions
- FK confirms timeline around May post locals hopefully avoiding a GE
- UA asks how it relates to the Thornhill Review
- LN checking on which platform would work best for looking into what collects good data etc.
- CL is happy with google forms but happy with suggestions from whoever is better with data
- LN issue with engagement, how do we overcome this and contact people who ignore emails etc. Even those active in branches will have engagement
- CL this is where branches get involved, trying to make sure we're encouraging people, regional chair engagement too
- KM raises studies highlight how tired communities are at being surveyed and seeing no change, so we need to ensure we only do this once and do it right
- CL notes this is where interim reports can help and ensure we're highlighting how we're taking things on board
- JN notes contact with LPs are rare and we should make sure we have something substantial
- FK what's the plan for if we don't find much good practice and how do we move forward from there

Action Points

- CL to confirm the wordings of the survey, input from ADS, Members Development Officer
- FK & JP to circulate survey to branch

- HJ to advertise the survey across all channels
- States YL Chairs (JN, LD, JR & LF) to circulate survey to members (including regional chairs)
- JL to introduce CL to Nicole Turner in LDHQ

Code of Conduct (Update)

YL International Instagram

- KP notes a lot of sister parties etc have an Instagram and it would be good to have a specific international insta
- LN suggests we may not be big enough to have a separate insta and raises the concern around it becoming dead and how that looks, citing branch pages as an example
- HJ says we can make sure there's an IC rep on CC
- KM notes this will take pressure from comms out and ensure international officers take on the responsibility to respond to international messages
- FK asks about how quickly it'll get attention etc. and the relative size of other groups
- WT notes follower numbers isn't the only metric engagement and conversations as well as the value added

The executive voted unanimously to allow an International Instagram account

Action Points

KM to bring this back post next IFLRY and LYMEC to see if it's taken off

Branch update

- This document was shared
- FK We used to have more branches than we do now and we've had branches that no longer exist, evidenced by people not putting the new legal disclaimer in etc. This is partly why it's important to de-credit, and make sure we have an accurate picture so we can build properly
- De credit 39, confirm 29, and 4 where conversations still need to happen
- JP notes these will be useful in working out where we need branches to support target seats and which spots we should work on increasing numbers
- JR they've identified new members, possibility to save branches

FK - notes it's about what currently exists not about what we hope will exist

Executive Reports

- UA informs none of our motions were accepted but it was competitive and we had positive feedback. Amendments will be considered and submitted.
 Work with other AOs such as LDCRE is positive, and ALDES (or Lib STEM - a moment of appreciation was taken)
- JL asks LN about FCC LN confirms their first meeting was the selection meeting and it went well
- Minutes thank you to LN and UA for their work as newly instated FCC and FPC
- FK brings up break down of Sheffield, impressive first timers, notes the lack of women and that sharing those stats may put women off
- LD confirms that over Christmas things die down
- JR successfully done co-options
- KP asks what the plan of the international officer is
- JR to improve relationships and would like a observer seat on IC
- KP apologies for not submitting a report and takes full responsibility, will be sending it over and it'll be added in
- NOW Elections Committee have codified how Y&W will operate, which will iron out future problems, there's been a few action days - Winchester & Salford (the latter was successful in electing a young candidate)
- LN asks Wales if they would like a rep to events committee
- JR confirms he will be staying on

Goal Setting

We have generic conversations, then more goal/action point issues and then the themes we concluded with at the end of the session

WT talks through SMART goals and provides a few examples

Layer 1 - Overarching goals for the organisation i.e making the organisation more accessible

Layer 2 - Large goals/projects i.e updating the policy books

Layer 3 - the goals to achieve layer 1 & 2 i.e ideally SMART

Policy book

Overall goal: Update the policy book and make it more accessible

- Policy book can be overwhelming and intimidating, potentially adopting what the party do for manifestos
- Translate it into other minority languages

FK - Website navigation - a reasonable accessible document on our website, ensuring everything that's easily findable can be understood

KM - notes it's important to consider which document is for what audience and how they interact

WT - suggests we could look beyond just documents and also include videos

HJ - suggests a divide on website between members and prospective voters

Branch data

- Making sure we have the data
- Fix all the resources for branches
- Getting money into branch pockets

Diversity and engaging women

- Specific goals around conference attendees
- KM brings up even specific goals how do we do this and how to we achieve this
- JL shares this issue has been flagged up to CGB, we're working with Lib Dem Women, and EB is working on this issue

- MS campaigning on women's issues making sure we're being wider in discussing women's issues
- WT making sure we're talking about the engaged women about what they're achieving
- HJ asks about LDW internal comms scope for putting our newsletter items in their newsletter and vice versa
- JP retention rate of members esp. women
- LN notes we need to acknowledge how the "graduation" successes work and how we ensure member engagement is reasonable
