At home, then, you will talk to an adult about their experience in picking their bank, what bank they use and why do they use that bank and share what you learned in your research. This could be a parent, an older, adult, sibling, mentor, pastor, neighbor, etc.

Then write a 1-2 paragraph reflection about the banks you looked at, what you learned in your research and your conversation. We will share these in class Wednesday for your grade.
