

Course Rationale/Purpose

Core Connections Integrated II is the second course in a five-year sequence of college preparatory mathematics courses that starts with Core Connections Integrated I and continues through Calculus Third Edition. Successful completion of this course will earn A-G credit.

Grading Rubric

Student's work will be graded on a 4-point rubric, as described below. Unfortunately, the current grading program, Q, was not designed for this type of grading system. There is a way to modify the grading program to work but this means that the following 3 things need to happen:

- Every assignment will always be out of 4 points.
- The maximum points given on an assignment will be 4.
- The percentage symbol for the grade should be ignored.

A student's letter grade will then be calculated according to the range described in the table below. I have also outlined the grading categories. To the right is a specific breakdown of the 4-point rubric.

0	You don't get it. I can't understand your thinking. Even with help, you still don't understand.
