

Design Document

<i>Business Purpose</i>	<p>This learning course is for members of any of the spring, summer, winter or fall leagues played in Philadelphia and the surrounding areas in both the singles and doubles leagues available. The advanced and most intermediate players enter the league having played in competitive matches previously and understand these scoring systems and norms. At the beginner level often times these players have played tennis for fun but never in a competitive environment and are unaware of how a match is played and scored beyond the basics of awarding points. This course will prepare them for their upcoming season and review some basics of scoring a game, set and match in tennis as well as some other unwritten rules and norms that seasoned players already know. This will ensure that even as these beginner level players are learning the game and having fun while working on their physical skills, they are also learning the basics of proper scoring and rules.</p>
<i>Target Audience</i>	<p>Beginner Level players in the league who may have a little experience playing tennis but don't know the basic knowledge on how to score a match, rules and norms of a game. This course is also available to be reviewed by all players in the league if they want a refresher if it has been a while since they have played in the league and may want to review scoring rules and language.</p>
<i>Training Time</i>	<p>10 minutes</p>
<i>Training Recommendation</i>	<p>1 module of Tennis Scoring and Rules course. The recommendation is an asynchronous e-learning course can be presented to new league members to review before their first match or even access during game play.</p>
