January – The Great Alone by Kristin Hannah (General Fiction)

A rich, intriguing novel of love, sacrifice and survival, set against the beauty of the Alaskan wilderness.

February- The Storied Life of A.J. Fikrey by Gabrielle Zevin (Literary Fiction)

A marvelously optimistic read about the future of books and bookstores and the people who love both.

March- Wildcat: The Untold Story of Pearl Hart by John Boessenecker (Biography)

A compelling story paired with extensive research brings together the myths and truths of American outlaw Pearl Hart.

April – The Maid by Nita Prose (Mystery)

A charming, clever and wholly original whodunit.
