Competition Details:

- 1. Schools may enter up to two teams at each year level.
- 2. Teams will need to register in the Auditorium at least 15 minutes prior to the start of their competition. The registration desk will be open from 10:00 am.
- 3. Each team has four members with one member being a designated runner. All teams provide their own pens/pencils/erasers/calculators. Scrap paper will be provided.
- 4. The year 9 competition is non-calculator. The year 10 competition allows calculators to be used, but competitors must bring their own.
- 5. Each competition will have 20 questions and will run for 45 minutes.
- 6. Students will be sitting on the floor when competing, i.e. no desk or chair.
- 7. While the competition is running, the other year level teams are to watch. Students are not to walk around the school.
- 8. Each school is required to provide at least one teacher/marker.
- 9. If it is a cold day then please dress appropriately.
- 10. There will be fruit and muesli bars available for student consumption. Students need to bring their own water bottles, drinks are NOT provided.
- 11. Lunch will be provided for the markers.

Competition Rules:

- 1. When the competition starts, each team's runner moves up to their marker and collects the Question 1 paper slip and returns to his/her team.
- 2. When a solution is obtained the runner takes the paper slip back to the marker.
 - a. If correct the marker will hand the next question to the runner. Each correct response earns 5 points for the team.
 - b. If not correct, each team may have five attempts for each of the 20 questions.
- 3. A team may abandon a question at any time and ask for the next question. Once a question has been abandoned the team may not go back to it.
- 4. If there is a dispute about a marker's ruling then the Judge is called in to adjudicate.
- 5. Markers will be instructed to jot down the time when each paper slip is presented for marking. This will help resolve any possible tie in scores.
- 6. The winning team is the one with the highest score. If there is more than one team that has the highest score then the fastest team will win.

Payment:

Schools must have paid their BOPMA subs to participate in this event.
