Richmond Tiny House Village:

For nearly three years, the Piedmont Community Service Crew has been working in collaboration with the Richmond Tiny House Village, Farm, and Garden. The Village aims to support unsheltered Richmond youth from ages twelve to twenty-four, and the hope is that it paves the way for similar projects to be created in surrounding areas.

To aid in this cause, PCSC has built a few tiny homes for the Village, and we were recently asked to construct its Welcome Office. Work on the new project started a few months ago, and we've been able to pour the concrete foundation, build the subfloor, and construct the framing for the walls and roof.

Many members of our crew have participated in the Tiny House Project, and some have put in incredible amounts of time and effort. Two of the main contributors are Yiyou Fang and Noah Sukeforth. Noah says that as a younger child, he really enjoyed building things and was passionate about engineering. The Tiny Houses provided a great activity to use those interests. He also explained how he has "found great meaning in those experiences" like the Tiny House Project, and community is a very important aspect of it.

We hope to be able to put up the windows next, and reinforce the roof and walls with exterior plywood, but it has already taken a considerable amount of PCSC's financial resources, and the final cost is estimated to be close to \$20k. Therefore, we are putting out a call for donations and support. Every contribution means a lot, and your help will give us the best chance of finishing construction on the office this fall.

The sooner we complete this project, the sooner we can help get the Tiny House Village up and running, so please consider donating!

Ethiopia Service Trip

In June, a team of high schoolers led by crew member Nathan Bekele embarked on a three-week journey to Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, partnering with St. Paul's Hospital and Melu'e Foundation, one of the country's few autism centers. The group's goal was to

raise awareness, deliver supplies, and provide hands-on support for children with developmental disabilities.

The trip began with strong community support, centered around the "Taste of Ethiopia" at Lemat Restaurant in Berkeley. It raised \$35,000 through ticket sales and a lively art auction featuring Ethiopian artists. Reflecting on the challenge and growth of volunteering abroad, Piedmont High School student Kidus Yalew shared, "Going to Ethiopia was a hard challenge, but it showed me that even far from home, friendship can feel like family. We spent our days helping out at the hospital and spending time with autistic kids. I saw how just being there for others can bring hope, even on the tough days." The trip concluded with a final ceremony, where Bekele, local hospital leaders, and nonprofit directors emphasized the ongoing commitment to autism advocacy. This initiative demonstrates how young people can foster meaningful change through cross-cultural partnerships, compassion, and perseverance—lessons that will continue to inspire all involved for years to come.
