Athletics:

Though school begins on August 27, you can begin planning for the athletic season in advance.

PIAA sports physical -

- All participating 7th/8th grade students must have a completed PIAA physical (dated after June 1, 2025) before stepping onto the court/field.
- Sections 1 to 5 within the PIAA sports physical packet must be completed and signed by a parent or guardian. **Section 6 must be completed by an authorized medical examiner (family doctor, urgent care, minute clinic).** The physical forms can be downloaded from the link - [PIAA Physical Form - Updated 3/22/2023](#)
- In previous years, CSD has partnered to offer discounted physicals with [Liberty Urgent Care Locations](#). At the moment, we are unsure if this agreement will be offered for the upcoming school year.

Concussion Test completion

- Concussion tests are a baseline assessment that helps our coaches ensure the concussion safety of our students as they participate in sports throughout the season.
- Within the first few school days, each team will host an information session after school (from 3:00-4:15 p.m.). Concussion testing will be completed during these sessions.
- Following the session, late buses will also be available to return students home, or you may pick up your child.
- WTHS is also conducting concussion testing between 8/4-8/8. Information is available in the most-recent district e-alert.

Medical Information:

- [Physical Form](#) - All incoming 6th grade students are required to provide the school nurse with a physical examination record.
- [Dental Form](#) - All incoming 7th grade students are required to provide the school nurse with a dental examination record.
- All seventh grade students should also have an updated immunization record including Tdap and Meningococcal Conjugate on file. Records can be emailed to paloam@centennialsd.org or dropped off to the nurse the first week of school.

- Students requiring medication during school hours need to have appropriate [paperwork](#) completed by parent/guardian and the prescribing provider. Seizure action plans, Asthma action plans, and allergy action plans can also be found at the same link. **Mrs. Palo will be available for medication drop off during building tours on August 21st, from 6:30-7:30. After that, medications can be brought to the nurse's office starting the afternoon of August 25th.**

Student Schedules and Other Information:

- Laptops: New students will receive Chromebooks on the first day of school during the first period. Students who still have their Chromebooks are expected to bring them to school on the first day, **fully charged**.

Transportation:

- If your child is taking the bus, he/she may not ride a different bus (even with a note).
